MOTION NO. <u>5588</u>

A MOTION approving and adding conditions to the County Executive's proposed strategy for the implementation of a county-wide enhanced 911 emergency telephone system.

WHEREAS, the County Council, in adopting Ordinance 5680, referred to King County voters the question of whether to impose a telephone excise tax to pay for the implementation and operation of a county-wide enhanced 911 emergency telephone system, and

WHEREAS, on November 3, 1981, the voters of King County approved the imposition of the telephone excise tax, not to exceed forty-five cents per month for each telephone access line, and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 5680 stipulates that the design of the enhanced 911 emergency telephone system and the request for proposals for the enhanced 911 emergency telephone system shall be determined by subsequent ordinance, and

WHEREAS, the County Executive has proposed a specific strategy for implementing the enhanced 911 emergency telephone system, and

WHEREAS, the County Executive's proposed strategy involves preparing detailed performance specifications for the system; soliciting a design and cost proposal from Pacific Northwest Bell (PNB); and proposing, subject to County Council approval, a contract with PNB, under the conditions that PNB meets the County's performance specifications at a reasonable and justifiable cost, and

WHEREAS, the County Executive's strategy is to also work with other potential vendors to determine whether they are qualified to provide the County's enhanced 911 emergency telephone system, and

WHEREAS, the County Executive has requested the County Council to approve the proposed strategy, subject to other

conditions proposed by the Council, and

WHEREAS, the County Council's intent in adopting Ordinance 5680 was to encourage competitive bidding among potential vendors at all appropriate phases of the program to ensure that the citizens of King County receive the optimum enhanced 911 emergency telephone system at the most reasonable cost, and

WHEREAS, the performance specifications will describe how the enhanced 911 emergency telephone system shall operate, including standards for the performance of the various components of the system (network, equipment, data management, and vendor requirements such as training and maintenance) and the formulation of a specific format to facilitate the presentation and review of the system's design and cost.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The County Council approves the County Executive's proposed
strategy for implementing an enhanced 911 emergency telephone
system, subject to the following conditions:

- A. The Council reaffirms its policy, per Ordinance 5680, to encourage competitive bidding at all appropriate phases of the program to ensure that the citizens of King County receive the optimum enhanced 911 emergency telephone system at the most reasonable cost.
- B. The County Council, in placing additional conditions upon the County Executive's proposed strategy, does not intend to lengthen the County Executive's proposed timeframe for implementing the County's enhanced 911 emergency telephone system.
- C. At the onset of preparing detailed performance specifications, the County Executive shall identify all potential vendors that, according to established criteria, appear to be qualified to provide an enhanced 911 emergency telephone system.
 - D. During the course of the development of the system's

detailed performance specifications, the County Executive is directed to provide the performance specifications to all potential vendors, for their review and comment, in a timely manner.

- E. Immediately following the completion of the system's detailed performance specifications, the County Executive shall:
- 1. Aggressively make the same available to all potential vendors for their review and comment.
- 2. Solicit, in the review and comment phase, from potential vendors:
- a. Specific comments regarding the adequacy of the specifications, preparatory to design, to ensure a quality and cost-effective system.
- b. Discussion of specific alternative specifications which, through design, may provide increased benefits either in quality or cost.
- c. Indication of whether the potential vendor is qualified according to established criteria, including: (1) the ability to provide the entire enhanced 911 emergency telephone system as a prime contractor; (2) experience with installing and/or operating a communications system similar in scope and complexity to the County's proposed enhanced 911 emergency telephone system; and (3) the ability to adhere to the County Executive's proposed timeline for implementing the enhanced 911 emergency telephone system.
- F. The detailed performance specifications shall be referred to the County Council for its review when they are made available to all potential vendors.
- G. Copies of all comments received in the review process shall be transmitted in a timely manner to the Chairperson of the County Council.
- H. Based on the results of the review and comment phase, the County Council reserves the right to require:

1. Increased participation by qualified vendors in the actual design phase of the program, up to and including a requirement to redefine the performance specifications to accommodate beneficial alternatives.

I. The results of the performance specifications review and comment phase and other phases of the County Executive's proposed strategy shall serve as the basis of the Council's future deliberations on the County Executive's recommendation regarding whether to issue a request for proposals or negotiate a sole source contract for the County's enhanced 911 emergency telephone system.
