2 A MOTION supporting the use of
3 Terminal 91 on Seattle's Elliott
4 Bay as the home port for the U.S.
5 Navy Carrier Battle Group.

6 WHEREAS, Terminal 91 served as a staging area and supply
7 depot from World War II through the mid-1970's, and

8 WHEREAS, the use of Terminal 91 as a navy installation
9 would complement the existing naval operations such as the
10 Trident submarine base at Bangor, the Naval Air Station on
11 Whidbey Island, and the ship repair yard at Bremerton, and

12 WHEREAS, there is an economic advantage from the Navy
13 operation at Terminal 91 which can be quantified through
14 increased jobs and payroll, and

15 WHEREAS, the presence of the Navy Facility would generate
16 sales and business and occupation taxes in support of local
17 government, and

18 WHEREAS, the existing import/export activities now located
19 at Terminal 91 can be transferred to other facilities, and

20 WHEREAS, Seattle and King County are an attractive
21 environment for the naval personnel involved, and

22 WHEREAS, the U.S. Navy will initiate an Environmental
23 Impact Statement process to identify the impacts of a new
24 installation, and


25 WHEREAS, this process is used to disclose the impact of the
26 operation and ways to mitigate the adverse effects on the
27 community, and


1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:
