A MOTION concurring with the King County Executive's allocation of \$49,000 of historic preservation Block Grant funds for restoration of five historic landmarks. The historic preservation Block Grant funds were previously appropriated under the 1983-1984 Housing and Community Development Block Grant Programs.

WHEREAS, the King County council has, through Ordinance 2991, and Ordinance 4828, adopted the goal of preserving and selectively encouraging the restoration of buildings, sites and areas that depict the evolution of King County, and

WHEREAS, the King County council, has through Ordinance 6830 and 6762 authorized the expenditure of 1983 and 1984 Housing and Community Block Grant funds for historic preservation projects, and

WHEREAS, the King County landmarks commission has reviewed project proposals based on published criteria and has named the following five historic landmarks as the highest priorities for King County grant assistance, and

WHEREAS, the county executive has reviewed and concurs with the above recommendations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The King County council endorses the county executive's allocation of historic preservation grant funds for the following restoration projects as recommended by the King County landmarks commission.

Issaquah Depot	\$14,000
Dougherty Farmstead (contingent upon HUD determination of eligibility)	12,000
Company House #75, Newcastle	5,000
Black Diamond Depot, Black Diamond	4,000
Carnegie Library, Auburn	14,000
