A MOTION related to Parks; requesting Burlington Northern to immediately consider the abandonment of railroad right-of-way which would link the Burke Gilman and Sammamish River Trails.

WHEREAS, the Burke Gilman and Sammamish River Trails provide recreational opportunities on a regional basis attracting park users from throughout King County, and

WHEREAS, the Burke Gilman and Sammamish River Trails were approved by the voters of King County in the Forward Thrust Program, and

WHEREAS, the Burke Gilman and Sammamish River Trails are included in the King County Urban Trails Plan, Bicycle Plan and recognized as priority park projects in the Shoreline, Northshore Community Plans, and

WHEREAS, by abandoning railroad right of way between Kenmore and Bothell, Burlington Northern would provide a trail that connects Gas Works Park, the University of Washington, Logboom Park and Marymoor Park, and

WHEREAS, the use of Burlington Northern railroad right of way between Kenmore and Bothell will eliminate the need for trail users to travel on SR-522 thereby improving public safety;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

Burlington Northern is requested to immediately consider abandonment of railroad right of way between Kenmore and Bothell for use as a public non-motorized trail which connects the Burke-Gilman and Sammamish River Trails. The missing link is a top priority CIP project that when developed will provide long term recreational benefits to all the residents of King County.

RE: Sammamish River Corridor

Dear Mr. Francis:

King County has been surveying the Sammamish River corridor between Kenmore and Bothell to determine the most feasible connection between the County's Burke-Gilman and Sammamish River Trails. These trails carry in excess of 7,000 users on peak days and the demand to connect them has grown each year. The increased use of the trails has resulted in many choosing unsafe routes between the two trails, placing themselves and other people in jeopardy.

King County has looked extensively at potential connections between the two trails. We and others have found the Burlington Northern right-of-way between Kenmore and Bothell (Line Segment No. 296) to be the best alternative from a development feasibility and safety perspective. We were very pleased when Burlington Northern announced in June, 1983, they anticipated filing for abandonment or discontinuance of this line within three years. Since that time, to our knowledge, there has been no further action by Burlington Northern.

We believe the benefits to King and Snohomish County residents from the public availability of this line are substantial and potentially life saving. Consequently, we respectfully request Burlington Northern to review this line for immediate abandonment.
