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MOTION NO. <u>6251</u>

A MOTION relating to implementation of the King County Comprehensive Plan--1985, setting out implementing measures which should have the highest priority.

WHEREAS, King County has adopted the King County

Comprehensive Plan--1985, its first countywide land use plan in

over twenty years, and

WHEREAS, King County is experiencing rapid growth and development which the King County Comprehensive Plan--1985 is intended to guide so as to protect environmental quality, assure cost-effective public services and promote housing and employment opportunities for King County residents, and

WHEREAS, prompt and effective implementation of the King County Comprehensive Plan--1985 is essential to achieve its objectives, and

WHEREAS, King County's 1985 Budget has begun implementation of the King County Comprehensive Plan--1985 by funding work on important issues such as open space, economic development, updated development standards, and inventories of utility needs, and

WHEREAS, King County's 1985 Budget also includes an Executive Contingency Fund of \$131,207 for implementation measures to be developed after adoption of the new Comprehensive Plan;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. Recognizing the funds already appropriated in the 1985 Budget, the following funded implementation work items are hereby reaffirmed as having high priority:

 1. Preparation of the Parks and Open Space Plan,
including protection of open space through acquisition,
incentives, land use regulations, and examination of potential
innovative mechanisms such as transfers of development rights
(TDRs);

- 2. Preparation of the Commercial/Industrial Vacant Land
 Inventory, which will provide a basis for an Economic
 Development Plan
- 3. Completion of the King County Transportation Plan, which will be a functional plan, including transportation service level standards and methods for prioritizing transportation capital investments;
- 4. Preparation of a comprehensive overhaul of the King County Zoning Code, which will clarify organization and language, eliminate redundancies, and streamline review procedures, as well as help carry out the new comprehensive plan;
- 5. Preparation of revised road improvement standards which will consolidate conflicting requirements and address the different needs of the urban, transitional and rural areas designated by the Comprehensive Plan and;
- 6. Preparation of a Preliminary Assessment of Water Supply and Fire Protection Issues in King County, which will identify water quality, supply, and fire flow capacity issues.
- B. The county executive is hereby requested to develop a work program and supplemental budget using the \$131,207

 Executive Contingency Fund, as well as resources already allocated in the 1985 Budget, to further implement the King County Comprehensive Plan--1985, with the following tasks to be given highest priority:

- 1. Preparation of amended or all-new zone classifications to implement the comprehensive plan's policies for protection of farm lands, forest lands and rural residential areas, and the necessary area zoning to apply farm land and forest land zone classifications consistent with the comprehensive plan map;
- 2. Preparation of a schedule and process for revising adopted community plans to implement the comprehensive plan's most important policies, including environmental protection and provision of affordable housing opportunities, in a way which fairly balances local and regional interests;
- 3. Preparation of a standard framework for interlocal agreements with cities, rural towns and other local governmental bodies, and initiation of specific agreements; and
- 4. Preparation of revisions to Title 20 (Planning) of the King County Code, to specify and clarify the relationships between the comprehensive plan and community and functional plans, land use regulations, and other activities and programs of King County government, and to provide clear procedures for updating and amending the comprehensive plan.
- C. The county executive is hereby requested to give highest priority to the following comprehensive plan implementation measures in developing the 1986 Budget for King County:
- Commencement of the community planning process for the Enumclaw Plateau; and
- 2. Preparation of an inventory and functional plan for protection of mineral resources and regulation of mineral

resource extraction and processing, to assure environmental protection and certainty for both affected communities and the mineral resource industry. 3. Revision of the subdivision code (Title 19). PASSED THIS 29th day of april, 1985. KING COUNTY COUNCIL KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON ATTEST:
