## MOTION NO. 6568

A MOTION related to the King County Park System authorizing the Executive to accept the deed to a one hundred twenty acre parcel of County Trust Lands administered by the Department of Natural Resources.

WHEREAS, on June 16, 1932 King County received title to a one hundred twenty acre parcel of property on the East Lake Sammamish Plateau via tax foreclosure proceedings, and

WHEREAS, on April 7, 1983 King County transferred title to this property to the State Forestry Board, currently the State Department of Natural Resources (DNR), and

WHEREAS, the timber on this property is, in the opinion of the DNR, of little value given the Red Alder, Cottonwood, second growth Douglas Fir which are found on this site, and

WHEREAS, the Cedar River Bowman, a nonprofit recreational organization with membership open to the general public has sponsored archery education, tournaments, archery clinics and practices on approximately sixty-five acres of this site since 1960, and

WHEREAS, there is an increasing need for public parks on the East Lake Sammamish Plateau based on residential, commercial and business development in the area, and

WHEREAS, RCW 76.12.072 provides for the transfer of state forest land from DNR to any county when the lands are needed for public park purposes; NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. Pursuant to the provisions of RCW 76.12.072, the King County executive is hereby authorized to execute the transfer of the following property from the DNR to the King County parks and recreation division for mutual benefits:

NW I/4, NE I/4, and SW I/4 of the SE I/4 of Section 12, T24N, R6E, KING COUNTY, STATE OF WASHINGTON.

- 1. Provided that, this land will only be used by King County for public park purposes: Use of this land for public purposes is consistent with the East Lake Sammamish Park Community Plan and the Comprehensive Plan.
- 2. The DNR will not authorize or conduct any timber harvesting on this site without prior written approval from the manager of the King County parks and recreation division.
- B. The executive is authorized to terminate this transfer should the DNR impose any conditions, in the judgment of King County, which are not compatible with a public park located in a rapidly growing area of King County. If termination of the DNR transfer is proposed, the executive will first report to the council for its consideration and possible action prior to the proposed final transmittal to the DNR.
