MOTION NO. 6578

A MOTION calling for the establishment of a users group for a countywide Automated Fingerprint Identification Computer System (AFIS).

WHEREAS, the county has proposed the purchase of an Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) which would be used without charge by all police departments within King County, and

WHEREAS, the county wishes to encourage all county police jurisdictions to participate in a county-wide AFIS, and

WHEREAS, the input of all county police jurisdictions is an important part of the development of a request for proposal for the purchase of the county AFIS and development of system operating procedures, and

WHEREAS, the State of Washington is considering purchase of an AFIS system primarily for identification oriented use which will be enhanced by compatibility with the county system; and

WHEREAS the County Police Chiefs Association has endorsed the county AFIS levy proposed at its meeting of June 1986;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The county executive is hereby directed to form a county AFIS users advisory committee with the same distribution of representation as the county Jail Advisory Commission with input on representatives from the county Police Chiefs Association and Suburban Mayors Association. This committee shall be formed no later than July 15, 1986. The users advisory committee will be charged with the responsibility to advise and make recommendations to the county on operating policy, the procurement request for proposal, and AFIS implementation and operation including efforts

1 to make the county system compatible with the state system. The  
2 county's intent is to encourage compatibility between AFIS systems  
3 to increase utilization and efficiency. The advisory committee  
4 shall work to coordinate with the state and other AFIS systems.
