A MOTION declaring the week of October 26 as Flood Awareness Week and encouraging all citizens of King County to take precautionary steps which will reduce potential damage to persons and property

WHEREAS, rainfall in King County varies from 36 inches near Puget Sound to 160 inches in the Cascade Mountains each year, and

WHEREAS, there are five major river systems and seventy-two smaller drainage basins which receive and control the release of surface water, and

WHEREAS, King County residents and property owners suffer from flooding as a result of heavy rainfall and fast runoff from snow melt, and

WHEREAS, the preservation and enhancement of water resources will contribute to increased livability in King County, and

WHEREAS, the protection of persons and property is a primary objective of King County government, and

WHEREAS, King County is taking steps to protect its citizens from the losses incurred from flooding by conducting three public information programs October 28, 29, and 30, 1986,

NOW, THEREFORE be it moved by the Council of King County:

A. The King County Council declares the week of October 26, 1986 as Flood Awareness Week, and

B. Encourages residents and property owners in the major flood impacted river basins to attend public information meetings at

Cedar River, 10/30/86	7:00 p.m. Greater Maple Valley Community Center
