A MOTION authorizing the Harborview Medical Center Board of Trustees to submit the proposed Major Institutions Master Plan to the City of Seattle.

WHEREAS, Harborview Medical Center, owned by King County and operated by the University of Washington pursuant to a contract with King County, is located within Seattle city limits, and

WHEREAS, Section 23.80.40 of the City of Seattle code requires certain major institutions desiring to expand its facilities or boundaries, change zoning, or displace housing to prepare and submit to the city a Major Institutions Master Plan (MIMP), the contents of which are outlined in the code, and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the MIMP from the City of Seattle's perspective is to serve as a land use planning document that sets the maximum level of development over a five to ten year time frame, and

WHEREAS, the Harborview Medical Center Board of Trustees has identified future capital needs and expansion plans that require the preparation of a MIMP pursuant to Seattle city code, and

WHEREAS, in Ordinance No. 7281 the King County council appropriated \$181,400 for preparation of a draft MIMP, and

WHEREAS, a consultant has completed the draft MIMP, which has been reviewed by a King County task force consisting of representatives from the department of public health, the budget office, the department of executive administration, the department of human resources, and council staff, and

WHEREAS, the draft MIMP was issued in May 1986 for public review and comments from city agencies, civic organizations, and individuals have been incorporated in the proposed MIMP, and

WHEREAS, the King County task force concludes that the MIMP document is a sound planning product for land use purposes and recommends submitting the proposed MIMP to the City of Seattle provided that issues regarding patient volumes, operational efficiencies, operating deficits, fiscal feasibility studies, parking needs, space standards, and non-capital alternatives are addressed in future planning documents, and

WHEREAS, Harborview Medical Center desires to submit the proposed MIMP to the City of Seattle to initiate the city's seven-month review process, and

WHEREAS, county authorization to proceed with the MIMP process does not commit either Harborview Medical Center or the county to carry out any element of the MIMP through bond financing or any other financing mechanisms, and

WHEREAS, the proposed MIMP is intended to meet the City of Seattle's land use code requirements and, as a result, does not meet the county's minimum requirements for a long range capital improvement plan pursuant to Ordinance No. 6818, and

WHEREAS, Harborview Medical Center is preparing a longrange capital improvement plan for future consideration by the council and such plan will address the issues identified by the task force, and

WHEREAS, the council has provided guidance to Harborview Medical Center regarding the standards the council uses to evaluate capital improvement plans such as Harborview Medical Center's long-range capital improvement plan,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. Harborview Medical Center is authorized to submit the proposed MIMP document, which represents a sound planning product for land use purposes, to the City of Seattle for the purpose of satisfying Seattle code requirements.

2	Medical Center's long-range capital improvement plan and
3	related financing proposals for the purpose of making decisions
4	on capital projects and financing of these projects.
