MOTION NO.

A MOTION establishing and defining the composition and functions of the committees of the King County Council and rescinding Motions 6450 and 6501.

WHEREAS, the interests of citizens of King County and the efficiency of the operations of the county council are best served by apportioning the duties and responsibilities of the council among several committees;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. Motions 6450 and 6501 are hereby rescinded.
- B. The council may go into committee-of-the-whole at any time. The committee-of-the-whole shall consider issues of interest to the entire council that may include decisions on projects included in the 1987 work program; appointments to the state legislature, the executive branch and numerous boards and commissions; review of countywide budget and program policy matters; and review of agendas for council meetings.
- C. The chair of the council shall appoint the chair, vice-chair and the membership of the standing committees, and any special ad hoc committees with consent of a majority of the councilmembers.

The standing committees are established as follows:

1. Community Planning & Development -- Function

To consider and make recommendations on community plans. To review and make recommendations on matters pertaining to special purpose district formations, mergers, annexations and other organizational changes; sewer and water agency comprehensive plans; utility franchises and easements; building, fire, plumbing and energy codes; fire flow and water pressure standards; and to

oversee other major relevant internal county operational processes. Special projects include the Snoqualmie and Bear Creek Community Plans; oversight of improvements to the land use permit process; annexation procedures and review of the Economic Development Plan.

2. Finance -- Function

To review and make recommendations on the executive proposed budget, financial plan, revenue estimates, and capital improvement program; to consider and make recommendations on all proposed supplemental appropriations, bond and investment proposals, and tax levies. Also to receive and examine reports of the county and/or state auditors and prepare appropriate recommendations to the county council. Special projects include monitoring of the 1987 adopted budget, review of bond proposals, bond refunding recommendations, zoo bond program implementation, budget policy revisions and capital project financing and budgeting issues.

Health and Environment -- Function

To review and make recommendations on county healthrelated programs and facilities, and on environmental matters
such as solid waste and water quality. Special projects include
consideration of health department programs, personnel and
organizational policies; Harborview admissions policy and master
plan; solid waste planning and operating issues including
hazardous materials, recycling programs, energy resource
recovery, Cedar Hills landfill matters and critical water supply
and groundwater management programs, and coordination of water
resource planning.

4. Administration and Justice -- Function

To consider and make recommendations on matters relating to: superior courts; district courts; prosecuting attorney; judicial administration; youth services; assessments; and executive

administration including personnel policies, records and elections, property retention and transfers, and cable television. To oversee and receive reports from the office of citizen complaints and the board of equalization. Special projects include monitoring and the comparable worth study and affirmative action plan; review of the superior court judgeship proposal; oversight of activities related to provision of space to conduct county functions; review of youth services facility and program plans; review of local government reorganization proposals; oversight of CIP implementation conducted by facilities management; consideration of new cable television recommendations, and business license code revisions.

5. Parks, Planning and Resources -- Function

To consider and make recommendations on matters related to countywide comprehensive land use policies and long-range planning for open space, resource lands, and rural and urban areas. To review and make recommendations on policies related to parks operations, zoning code revisions, shoreline management, and cultural and natural resources. Special projects include review of recommendations and functional plan proposals to implement the 1985 Compehensive Plan such as the open space plan; review of wetlands and short plat regulations and agriculture; forestry and rural zones ordinances; and assessment of parks operations.

6. Public Works and Facilities -- Function

To review and make recommendations on policies related to public works, the county airport, surface water management, and the Muncipality of Metropolitan Seattle (METRO) transportation and water quality issues. Also to review and make recommendations on matters relating to the establishment and vacation of county streets and roads; surface water management utility implementation and other public works related policies and fees. Special projects

 include monitoring of surface water utility implementation; oversight of public works long-range computer systems planning, review of the King County airport master plan and oversite of METRO projects and decisions.

7. Public Safety and Economic Development

To consider public policies related to public safety, adult detention and the promotion and financing of economic growth and publicly and privately sponsored employment and training programs. To enhance economic growth by coordinating with and participating in public and private organizations, including the port of Seattle, the private industry council, the economic development district, state departments of commerce and community development, and the economic development council.

Special projects include oversight of the new county jail; implementation of police patrol improvements including the car-per-officer and court overtime reduction projects; and monitoring of progress on regional crime prevention and law enforcement including implementation of the new AFIS program; and the review of the county's business revitalization program.

8. Housing & Human Services -- Function

To review and make recommendations on policies related to human services issues such as mental illness, developmental disabilities, aging, and women's programs, public defense, and on housing policies and plans. Special projects include review of community development block grant policy and proposals, the public defender study and contracts and human services program plans and policy proposals including developmental disability and mental health plans and the affordable housing policy plan.

D. Proposed legislation may be introduced by any councilmember. Ordinarily proposed legislation will be introduced by the district representative. Proposed legislation to be heard by the zoning and subdivision examiner will

customarily be introduced by the chair of the parks, planning and resources committee.

- E. The date and time of standing committee meetings shall be determined by the chair of each such committee. At least twenty-four hours prior to the meeting, an agenda shall be posted outside the council chambers and shall include the time and place of the committee meeting. Any member of the council present at a meeting of any standing committee, though not a member thereof, shall be entitled to participate in the deliberations of such committee, but shall not be entitled to vote therein unless designated a member pro tem by the committee chair.
- F. In order for a proposed ordinance or motion to be reported out by a standing committee, a majority of the membership of that committee must sign a majority recommendation. The majority recommendation of the committee may be "do pass," "do pass as amended," "do pass attached substitute," do not pass," "no recommendation," or "postpone indefinitely". Minority reports may also be submitted by one or more members of the committee.
- G. In the absence of the chair and vice-chair of a committee, a committee member, designated by the committee chair, may serve as chair of the meeting.
