A MOTION requesting the National Commission of the United States Bicentennial to recognize and grant official status to King County as an official Bicentennial Community.

WHEREAS, King County is meeting participation requirements of the Washington State and National Commission of the United States Bicentennial of the Constitution by holding open house in the King County Courthouse on Saturday, September 19, 1987, and

WHEREAS, King County's Program, "The Courthouse: The Constitution at Work," will enable the general public to meet with the King County executive and council, prosecutor and other dignitaries from the national, state and local governments and to observe judicial proceedings through mock trials, some of which will be portrayed by actors and actresses in 1789 period costumes, and

WHEREAS, King County designates the co-chairs and members of the King County Centennial Commission as the officials who will oversee and approve procedures and functions relating to the Bicentennial Celebration, and

WHEREAS, the King County Centennial Commission will participate in the "Freedom Fair" activities at the Seattle Center on September 19, 1987 to help celebrate the Constitution of the Bicentennial;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

King County is respectfully requesting Washington State and the National Commission on the Bicentennial of the U.S Constitution to grant King County status and designation as an Official Bicentennial Community.
