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WHEREAS, there are numerous high school students of high scholastic ability who hope to attend college but need to earn money to pay their own way;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The county executive is directed to reserve sufficient Summer Work Training Employment funds to implement Summer Day Camp Programs in the eight unincorporated area council districts as follows:

 The program will use existing summer day camp providers who now operate nine-week summer day camp programs and who agree to meet conditions and goals of the King County Summer Day Camp Program.

2. Twenty schoolchildren aged six to ten, identified by their respective school teachers and principals as likely to benefit from the program, will be assigned to each King County Summer Day Camp.

3. Ten high school aged counselors, identified by their respective school teachers and principals as likely to be successful tutors and counselors, and who plan to attend college and who meet Summer Youth Employment Training Program standards, will be assigned to each King County Summer Day Camp

4. Counselors will be assigned to two children as mentors, tutors and advisors for the duration of the summer camp program and will be required to provide at least one hour of individual tutoring in reading per day for each camper. The balance of the day will be devoted to recreation and other activities.

B. The county council will lead an effort to raise scholarship funds for each summer camp counselor which will amount to \$1,000 when the counselor enters an accredited higher education program or institution. The scholarship funds will be held in trust in the name of each counselor.

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C. By May 15, 1988, the executive shall appoint, subject to confirmation by the county council, a four-member King County Summer Day Camp Advisory Council consisting of a representative from the Washington Literacy Council, an elementary school reading teacher recommended by his or her school principal, a recreation specialist from the King County division of parks and natural resources, and a representative from the private sector whose organization is participating in the scholarship program. The Advisory Council shall:

 Monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of the King County Summer Day Camp Program.

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2. Meet periodically to review program progress and results.

3. Report to the council as needed for the duration of the Program, and provide a final evaluation report to the council at the conclusion of the Program.

D.The King County Summer Day Camp Program shall be coordinated and supervised by the manager of the County Work Training Program, subject to approval by the Advisory Council.
