MOTION NO. 7338

A MOTION declaring the days of October 17 to November 1, 1988 as Flood Awareness '88 and encouraging all citizens of King County to take precautionary steps which will reduce potential flood damage to persons and property.

WHEREAS, annual rainfall in King County varies from 36 inches near Puget Sound to 160 inches in the Cascade Mountains, and

WHEREAS, there are four major river systems and 72 smaller drainage basins which receive surface water run-off, and

WHEREAS, the protection of persons and property is a primary objective of King County government, and

WHEREAS, the preservation and enhancement of water resources will contribute to increased livability in King County, and

WHEREAS, King County residents and property owners suffer from flooding as a result of intense rainfall and rapid snow melt, and

WHEREAS, King County is taking steps to protect its citizens from the losses incurred from flooding by conducting four Flood Awareness '88 Open Houses scheduled October 18, 19, 20, and 25, 1988;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The County Council declares the days of October 17 to November 1, 1988, as Flood Awareness '88, and

B. Encourages residents and property owners in the major flood-impacted river basins to attend Flood Awareness '88 Open Houses:
