MOTION NO. 7482

A MOTION to establish the Citizen Committee to prepare recommendations to the King County Council concerning green spaces, green belts and trails to be included in a 1989 bond measure.

WHEREAS, in Motion 7318 King County council indicated its intent to prepare a bond ballot measure for November, 1989 to provide for the acquisition and preservation of green spaces, greenbelts and trail rights-of-ways, and

WHEREAS, an important component of this effort will be to establish a countywide citizen advisory committee to recommend to the council suitable green spaces, greenbelts and trails for inclusion in the bond, and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the council expressed in Motion 7318 to also provide the citizen committee with appropriate directives and criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the council of King County:

A. A countywide committee shall be established with the following citizens and representatives from the city of Seattle, suburban cities and unincorporated King County:

Additional members may be appointed at a later date by the chair of the council after conference with the other councilmembers.

- B. The purpose of the committee is to provide oversight of the development of a bond to acquire or advance the appropriate use of green spaces, green belts and trails. The committee shall advise and assist the King County council to identify projects to include in a bond of a maximum face amount in the range of \$75 million to \$115 million. The committee has the following specific responsibilities:
- 1. Review to confirm their continued merit of those proposed projects in unincorporated King County identified in Ordinance No. 8551 and which are submitted to the committee by letter from the chair of the council or the executive.
- 2. Review and rank those parcels identified in Motion No. 7278 for possible inclusion in a bond issue.
- 3. Review and rank for inclusion in a bond issue additional proposed projects as submitted by letter from the executive or the chair of the council.
- 4. Review those proposed projects sponsored by city jurisdictions and confirm their suitability for a bond issue. Should a question arise concerning the suitability of a project, the committee shall address the issue with the appropriate jurisdiction.

- 5. Assess whether all major regions within the county are reasonably represented among the proposed projects and submit recommendations to the King County council on appropriate responses to correct any material disparity.
- 6. Identify any unique and irreplaceable open space opportunities of critical importance that should be added to the bond acquisitions.
- C. The following criteria shall be applied by the committee in two stages to assist it to fullfill its responsibilities:
- 1. In the first stage of evaluating a project, it must satisfy one or more of the criteria below in order to be considered for inclusion in the green spaces, green belts and trails bond ballot measure.
- a. The project is located in an incorporated city or in an urban or transitional area or an urban activity center of the county as designated by the King County comprehensive plan map,
- b. The parcel is likely to be adversely affected, within a reasonable period of time, by development or other action that would materially diminish its qualitative values as open space,
- c. The project is at least 100 acres and would be acquired in order to create a natural resource park,
- d. The project would expand an existing natural resource park,
- e. The project will provide or enhance public access to shorelines,
- f. The project is an element or will improve an element of a trail corridor.
- 2. The following attributes shall be considered when a project meeting any of the above criteria is further evaluated for inclusion in a bond ballot measure. The consideration of the attributes by the committee should reflect the differing qualities and needs of open space located in urban and rural areas.

- a. The quality and diversity of wildlife habitat advanced by the project,
- b. The quality or breadth of a scenic resource advanced by the project, accounting for community-wide need,
- c. The quality or amount of the shoreline access provided or enhanced by the project, accounting for community-wide need,
- d. The extent to which a project acts as, materially contributes to or enhances a community separator,
- e. The ability of the project to act as, materially contribute to or enhance a trail or natural area,
- f. The potential of the project for passive recreation use, accounting for community-wide need
  - g. The potential of the project for agricultural use.
- D. The committee shall submit its findings to the King County council by June 15, 1989.
