MOTION NO. **7531**

A MOTION authorizing the King County executive or his designee to sign and submit a grant application to the United States Department of Health and Human Services for the purpose of funding a Family Life Demonstration Project.

WHEREAS, King County's funding policies for the Health and Human Services Fund emphasize "services which help to prevent problems for young children and families," and "early intervention services for all children and families," and

WHEREAS, King County has made a commitment to serving teenage parents and their children through the Young Family Independence Program, and

WHEREAS, there is a need to provide additional services to teenage parents and to pregnant teenagers, and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Office of Adolescent Pregnancy is requesting proposals for projects which provide care services to pregnant adolescents, adolescent parents, and their families, and

WHEREAS, the King County work training program is coordinating the Young Family Independence Program with the King County public health department, cooperative extension, school districts, youth service bureaus, and many other public and private agencies, and

WHEREAS, funds received from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services may not be used to supplant any other funding;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The King County executive is authorized to apply for a \$200,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services for the purpose of starting a Family Life Demonstration Project for young teen parents and pregnant teens as an addition to the existing Young Family Independence Program.


B. Matching funds for this grant would be provided through the Health and Human Services funding of the Young Family Independence Project.

C. The grant would allow King County's Young Family Independence Program to provide services to an additional 44 pregnant adolescents and younger teenage parents and increase services to all teenage parents enrolled in the Young Family Independence Program.

D. The Executive is directed to continue to seek alternative state and local funding sources to maintain YFIP services.
