A MOTION authorizing the King County Executive to make a grant application to the Washington State Department of Ecology for funds in the approximate amount of \$1,063,900 to support a comprehensive waste reduction and recycling program in the Snoqualmie Valley and the City of Issaquah.

WHEREAS, King County has adopted solid waste management policies which establish waste reduction and recycling programs as basic elements of King County's solid waste management system, and

WHEREAS, King County has adopted a goal of reducing and recycling the waste stream by sixty-five percent by the year 2000, and

WHEREAS, implementation of a Waste Not Washington Communities recycling program in the Snoqualmie Valley and the City of Issaquah will demonstrate and test the feasibility of an innovative, comprehensive approach to rural and small city recycling, and

WHEREAS, Phase I of the Department of Ecology's Waste
Reduction and Recycling Grant Program, funded through RCW 43.83A
and 43.99F, provides for the award of grants by the Department of
Ecology for demonstration project grants, and

WHEREAS, the council of King County recognizes an obligation to provide the amount of \$319,100 as a required cash match in support of this program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- The King County executive is hereby authorized to make application to the Department of Ecology for funds in the approximate amount of \$1,063,900 for a comprehensive rural and small city recycling program in the City of Issaquah and Snoqualmie Valley, including the cities of Duvall, Carnation, Snoqualmie, and North Bend;
- The King County executive is hereby authorized to file and execute such application and to enter into and execute such contracts as are required by the grantor;
- The King County executive is also authorized to enter into and execute such subcontracts as are necessary for the implementation of the project;
- The Department of Ecology is hereby assured of full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act.
