A MOTION requesting the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development to allocate an additional 90 rental assistance vouchers or certificates to the Housing Authority of the County of King for low-income elderly, physically and developmentally disabled renters due to high vacancy rates and unmet housing needs of low-income people in southwest King County served by Mallard Lake Park, a White Center apartment complex. Federal approval of modifications to the 1988 and 1989 Rental Rehabilitation Program design is also requested to permit King County to loan a portion of the funds needed to rehabilitate Mallard Lake Park.

WHEREAS, 109 elderly, low-income individuals, have been identified in need of affordable rental housing in southwest King County, and WHEREAS, 89 low-income physically and 120 developmentally disabled

WHEREAS, 89 low-income physically and 120 developmentally disabled individuals have been identified in need of accessible and affordable rental housing in southwest King County, and

WHEREAS, the growth of households in need of housing assistance in King County has exceeded the rate of growth in any other area of the State of Washington and of the region, and

WHEREAS, Mallard Lake Park, formerly known as Kingston Village, contains 330 units and by its size and location is a housing resource for southwest King County, and

WHEREAS, Mallard Lake Park currently has 90 vacancies out of 330 available rental units, a vacancy rate of 27 percent, and

WHEREAS, this vacancy rate is far in excess of the southwest King County vacancy rate of 4.3 percent as reported by Cain and Scott, Inc., and

WHEREAS, the high vacancy rate and deteriorating condition of Mallard Lake Park jeopardizes the vitality of White Center, a primary community development area identified by King County policy;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The United States Department of Housing and Urban Development is hereby requested to allocate an additional 90 rental assistance vouchers or certificates to low-income elderly, physically and developmentally disabled tenants.

BE IT FURTHER MOVED,

The King County council requests United States Department of Housing and Urban Development approval to modify the 1988 and 1989 King County Rental Rehabilitation Program design to use up to 50 percent of the entitlement grant amount for the rehabilitation of one-bedroom units, increased from 30 percent, to facilitate renovation of apartments at Mallard Lake Park.
