- B. The purpose of this citizen oversight committee is to provide advice and counsel to King County government and oversight during implementation of the open space bond. Its responsibilities shall include the following:
- 1. Presentation of a semi-annual report to the King County council describing the status of the implementation of the open space bond projects. The committee will receive semi-annual reports from the participating local governments describing their implementation of bond projects.
- 2. In the event a government wishes to use unanticipated bond proceeds, as defined in Ordinance No. 9071, for projects already authorized by the ordinance, the citizen oversight committee shall review the proposed use of funds and comment as appropriate to the executive and council.
- 3. In the event a government wishes to use unanticipated bond proceeds, as defined in Ordinance No. 9071, for projects not authorized by the open space bond ordinance, the committee shall submit to the executive and the council a recommendation regarding the merits of such use.
- 4. In the event a governmental agency applies for use of conservation futures funding, the citizens oversight committee shall, within 30 days of receipt, consider and make recommendations on the request to the King County executive. The executive shall transmit to the King County council the committee's recommendation in conjunction with his recommendation on the request, and the appropriate legislation.

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
