A MOTION authorizing applications for funding assistance for open space projects to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation as provided by the Washington Wildlife and Recreation Coalition Fund.

WHEREAS, King County has approved an "Open Space Plan" which identifies trails, natural areas and greenbelts in various parts of the county, and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Washington Wildlife and Recreation Coalition legislation, state funding assistance has been authorized and may be made available to aid in financing the cost of land for parks and open space, and

WHEREAS, King County considers it in the best public interest to acquire those open space parcels through the county;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The King County executive is authorized to make formal applications to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for funding assistance.

B. Any fund assistance so received from the 1990 Washington Wildlife and Recreation Coalition Fund shall be used in the acquisition of the following projects:

- Beaver Lake Wetlands            196.0 acres    North of Issaquah
- Clark Lake            85.0 acres    East of Kent
- Cottage Lake        20.88 acres   East of Woodinville
- Lake Desire/
- Spring Lake        380.0 acres   East of Kent

- Salmon Creek       76.0 acres    North of Normandy Park

C. Any other fund assistance so received shall be used in the acquisition or development of the following projects:

7 Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation be placed in use  
8 as an outdoor recreation facility and be retained in such use  
9 in perpetuity unless as otherwise provided and agreed to by the  
10 county council and the Interagency Committee for Outdoor  
11 Recreation.

12 G. This resolution become part of a formal application to  
13 the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.

14 H. Adequate notification has been given and opportunity  
15 provided for public input and that published notices have  
16 identified affected flood plains and/or wetlands, if  
17 applicable.
