2 A MOTION declaring the existence of an
3 emergency due to unusual weather conditions
4 consisting of heavy rainfall and other
5 unknown conditions causing a rapid rise of
6 Horseshoe Lake, near Black Diamond,
7 Washington, which threatens to close access
8 to Horseshoe Lake Development on a King
9 County road; and waiving the requirements
10 for competitive bidding or formal
11 solicitation; and waiving Minority and
12 Women's Business Enterprises requirements
13 for such repairs; and ratifying and
14 confirming the Local Proclamation of
15 Emergency issued by the King County
16 Executive on April 17, 1991.

17 WHEREAS, weather conditions consisting of heavy rainfall,
18 and other unknown conditions are threatening to close access to
19 Horseshoe Lake Development on a King County road; and

20 WHEREAS, extensive damage has and is still occurring to a
21 King County road; and

22 WHEREAS, public property is and will continue to be damaged
23 unless further efforts are taken to reduce the threat to public
24 property; and

25 WHEREAS, such repair work to prevent closure of the County
26 road access to Horseshoe Lake Development must begin
27 immediately in order to minimize the risk of public property
28 damage; and

29 WHEREAS, there is an emergency present which necessitates
30 activation of the King County Disaster Preparedness Plan, and
31 utilization of emergency powers granted pursuant to RCW
32 35.40.180, RCW 38.52 and K.C.C. 12.52; and

33 WHEREAS, the ordinary requirements for formal competitive
34 bidding of the construction contracts pursuant to RCW 36.32,
35 and formal solicitation requirements for professional/technical
36 service consultant contracts, and/or the purchase of tangible
37 personal property pursuant to K.C.C. 4.16, and compliance with
38 Minority and Women's Business Enterprises requirements pursuant
39 to K.C.C. 4.18 for such repairs must be waived in order to
40 prevent delay in beginning such repair work; and

1 WHEREAS, the King County Executive issued a Local
2 Proclamation of Emergency on April 17, 1991, pursuant to RCW
3 36.40.180, RCW 38.52 and K.C.C. 12.52, and attached hereto and
4 by this reference made a part hereof, and whose receipt is
5 hereby acknowledged by the Council;

6 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

7 A. The King County Council declares that an emergency
8 exists in King County whereby the public interest would suffer
9 material injury if necessary repair work is delayed.

10 B. The ordinary requirements for competitive bidding of
11 construction contracts pursuant to RCW 36.32, and formal
12 solicitation requirements for professional/technical service
13 consultant contracts, and the purchase of tangible personal
14 property pursuant to K.C.C. 4.16, for such repair work by the
15 Department of Public Works, in order to prevent delay in
16 beginning such repair work are hereby waived.

17 C. The ordinary Minority and Women's Business Enterprises
18 requirements pursuant to K.C.C. 4.18 are hereby waived as to
19 the individual project contracts, provided that compliance with
20 Minority and Women's Business Enterprises requirements shall be
21 met by the collective group of construction contracts and by
22 the collective group of consultant contracts, as required
23 pursuant to this emergency declaration.

24 D. The King County Council hereby ratifies and confirms
25 the Local Proclamation of Emergency pursuant to K.C.C.
26 12.52.030 (B)(12).
