2 A MOTION requesting the King County
3 Executive to develop and implement a
4 waste reduction and recycling grant
5 program.

6 WHEREAS, solid waste generated by commercial enterprises
7 comprise forty percent of King County's mixed municipal solid
8 waste stream, and

9 WHEREAS, solid waste generated by individuals residing in
10 multi-family residential dwellings comprise eleven percent of
11 King County's mixed municipal solid waste stream, and

12 WHEREAS, King County has provided \$835,000 in grants to
13 King County suburban cities to establish residential waste
14 reduction and recycling programs, and

15 WHEREAS, King County and the suburban cities have
16 established residential waste reduction and recycling programs,
17 and

18 WHEREAS, King County has adopted a sixty-five percent
19 waste stream reduction goal,

20 WHEREAS, commercial and multi-family residence waste
21 reduction and recycling programs must be established so that
22 King County's waste stream reduction goal is actually achieved.

23 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

24 The King County Solid Waste Division is requested to
25 develop a waste reduction and recycling grant program to be
26 included in the division's 1992 budget request. The grant
27 program should provide for the following:

28 A. Monies set aside to fund the waste reduction and
29 recycling grant program shall be invested, and the associated
30 interest income shall accrue for the benefit of the program.

31 B. Grants monies are to be used for program development
32 and initial implementation costs for the following programs and
33 according to the following priority order:

34 1. commercial collection

- 1 2. multi-family residence collection
- 2 3. auxiliary residential and commercial yard waste
- 3 collection
- 4 4. other programs designed to complement or enhance
- 5 existing waste reduction and recycling programs.

6 C. To be eligible to participate in the grant program a
7 grant applicant must have:

- 8 1. implemented a residential household collection
- 9 program,
- 10 2. adopted a procurement policy,
- 11 3. committed to adopt a building code that requires
- 12 waste reduction and recycling opportunities for new
- 13 construction by January 1, 1993, and
- 14 4. for those applicants that do not mandate source
- 15 separation, adopted a rate structure that encourages waste
- 16 reduction and recycling.

17 D. The grant program shall be made available to all
18 eligible suburban cities and to the King County Solid Waste
19 Division for the unincorporated areas. A suburban city is
20 considered to be eligible if it has complied with the
21 conditions cited above or has agreed to comply with the
22 conditions by December 31, 1994. However, grant funds will be
23 not be disbursed to a suburban city until compliance with the
24 conditions have been achieved.

25 E. Entities shall have until June 30, 1992, to apply for
26 participation in the program. The amount of grants shall be
27 based upon the applicants' per capita share of the amount of
28 available funds.

1 F. Participants shall have until December 31, 1994, to
2 receive grant funds under the program.
