A MOTION requesting the King County Executive to develop and implement a waste reduction and recycling grant program.

WHEREAS, solid waste generated by commercial enterprises comprise forty percent of King County's mixed municipal solid waste stream, and

WHEREAS, solid waste generated by individuals residing in multi-family residential dwellings comprise eleven percent of King County's mixed municipal solid waste stream, and

WHEREAS, King County has provided \$835,000 in grants to King County suburban cities to establish residential waste reduction and recycling programs, and

WHEREAS, King County and the suburban cities have established residential waste reduction and recycling programs, and

WHEREAS, King County has adopted a sixty-five percent waste stream reduction goal,

WHEREAS, commercial and multi-family residence waste reduction and recycling programs must be established so that King County's waste stream reduction goal is actually achieved.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The King County Solid Waste Division is requested to develop a waste reduction and recycling grant program to be included in the division's 1992 budget request. The grant program should provide for the following:

- A. Monies set aside to fund the waste reduction and recycling grant program shall be invested, and the associated interest income shall accrue for the benefit of the program.
- B. Grants monies are to be used for program development and initial implementation costs for the following programs and according to the following priority order:
  - 1. commercial collection

- 2. multi-family residence collection
- 3. auxiliary residential and commercial yard waste collection
- 4. other programs designed to complement or enhance existing waste reduction and recycling programs.
- C. To be eligible to participate in the grant program a grant applicant must have:
- 1. implemented a residential household collection program,
  - 2. adopted a procurement policy,
- 3. committed to adopt a building code that requires waste reduction and recycling opportunities for new construction by January 1, 1993, and
- 4. for those applicants that do not mandate source separation, adopted a rate structure that encourages waste reduction and recycling.
- D. The grant program shall be made available to all eligible suburban cities and to the King County Solid Waste Division for the unincorporated areas. A suburban city is considered to be eligible if it has complied with the conditions cited above or has agreed to comply with the conditions by December 31, 1994. However, grant funds will be not be disbursed to a suburban city until compliance with the conditions have been achieved.
- E. Entities shall have until June 30, 1992, to apply for participation in the program. The amount of grants shall be based upon the applicants' per capita share of the amount of available funds.
