A MOTION requesting the executive to survey county employees to determine interest in employer-assisted housing as an employee benefit.

WHEREAS, increasingly in the private sector, employee housing is becoming a cost of doing business, and

WHEREAS, a growing number of employers are choosing to offer a variety of housing benefit programs that meet some of their employees' affordable housing needs and that address some of the employer's need for a stable, well-qualified workforce, and

WHEREAS, employer-assisted housing facilitates the development of local housing partnerships, which are becoming increasingly important providers of affordable housing to moderate-income families, and

WHEREAS, employer-assisted housing enables employers to compensate employees using low-cost, off-budget fiscal tools that would be more valuable to public employees than small salary increases and less expensive than big wage increases, and

WHEREAS, until recently efforts to bargain housing assistance were hampered by prohibitions in the Taft-Hartley Act which were recently removed by Congress, and

WHEREAS, the average cost of a house in King County is \$153,000, requiring an average household income of \$50,384, and

WHEREAS, according to the county office of human resources, the average annual wage for a King County employee is \$41,723, and

WHEREAS, the workforce of the 1990s is a young one which has not accumulated any housing equity, and

WHEREAS, stable dwelling arrangements are essential for nurturing stable families, and

1	WHEREAS, the executive stated in his state of the county
2	address on January 28, 1991: "As an employer, King County
3	should provide the leadership in supporting families by setting
