A MOTION authorizing the King County executive to submit an application for funding and supporting the project recommendations of the executive for the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) 1992 Emergency Shelter Grants Program.

WHEREAS, housing the homeless is a pressing community and human services need, and

WHEREAS, emergency shelter and services are critical to homeless families working toward self-sufficiency, and

WHEREAS, eligible activities for Emergency Shelter Grants Program (ESGP) funds include homeless prevention assistance, supportive services, rehabilitation, and operating costs associated with emergency shelter, and

WHEREAS, King County will receive an entitlement of \$103,000 of ESGP funding from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, and

WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Housing Affordability Strategy contains strategies to match the needs of the homeless in King County with the resources available, and

WHEREAS, a request for proposal process was conducted in November 1991, and

WHEREAS, proposals were received and evaluated based on King County funding policies and ESGP rules, and

WHEREAS, the King County council has appropriated funds for ESGP in Budget Ordinance 10182;

The recommendations of the King County executive for emergency shelter projects as specified in Attachments A and B are supported.

BE IT FURTHER MOVED,

The King County executive is hereby authorized to submit a 1992 program application to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development for the ESGP.

The King County executive is authorized to enter into contracts with agencies to provide 1992 ESGP funds for recommended projects.
