2 A MOTION authorizing the Executive to
3 submit grant applications to the
4 Washington State Department of Ecology to
5 fund projects to improve water quality in
6 King County.

7 WHEREAS, the Washington State Legislature has created the
8 Centennial Clean Water Fund for the joint funding of water
9 quality improvement activities and facilities with other public
10 agencies in the state pursuant to Chapter 70.146 RCW, and

11 WHEREAS, the Washington State Legislature has required the
12 development of the 1987, 1989 and 1991 Puget Sound Water
13 Quality Management Plans that require local governments to
14 conduct certain planning and implementation activities related
15 to preserving or improving water quality in Puget Sound and in
16 water tributary to Puget Sound, and

17 WHEREAS, the Washington State Department of Ecology has
18 invited eligible project sponsors to submit proposals for
19 Centennial Clean Water Fund grants for fiscal year 1993, and

20 WHEREAS, \$52,500,000 in total funds will be available for
21 a variety of water pollution control facilities and activities,
22 and

23 WHEREAS, the state grant share generally will be 50 to 75
24 percent of the total eligible cost of a project, and

25 WHEREAS, eligible projects include: water pollution
26 control facilities and activities that are on freshwater lakes
27 and rivers including lake restoration projects; water pollution
28 control facilities and activities that address non-point source
29 pollution, including watershed planning and implementation;
30 groundwater facilities and activities; and discretionary
31 projects that may not qualify in other funding categories and
32 that address water quality, and

33 WHEREAS, applications will be accepted by the Washington
34 State Department of Ecology until February 21, 1992, and

1 WHEREAS, the Washington State Department of Ecology will
2 formally offer financial assistance to the highest priority
3 ranked proposals in July, 1992, and

4 WHEREAS, no single government entity may receive more
5 financial assistance in a funding category than the ceiling
6 specified for that category in Chapter 70.146 RCW, and

7 WHEREAS, for the purposes of Centennial Grant proposals,
8 the Washington State Department of Ecology has recognized the
9 Seattle/King County health department as a separate government
10 entity and not subject to the King County ceiling;

11 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

12 A. The county executive is hereby authorized to develop
13 and submit to the Washington State Department of Ecology
14 proposals for water quality activities and facilities as
15 described in Attachment A.

16 B. The county executive is hereby authorized to determine
17 in each funding category the priority of all proposals for
18 which a preliminary offer of financial assistance is made so
19 that the ceiling amount for that category is not exceeded.

20 C. The county executive is hereby authorized to negotiate
21 agreements with the Washington State Department of Ecology to
22 accept grant funding for activities and facilities receiving
23 final offers of financial assistance in fiscal year 1993 from
24 the Washington State Department of Ecology.

25 D. Agreements to accept grant funding which are
26 negotiated shall not be executed by the county executive until
27 approved by motion of the Council.

28 E. The Director of the Seattle/King County health
29 department is requested to explore all possible alternative
30 funding sources for that portion of required grant matching
31 funds that would exceed the current CX funding level for the
32 department's groundwater programs.

1 F. Council authorization of grant applications does not
2 constitute a committment to provide CX funding at levels
3 projected in the applications.
