MOTION NO. 8517

A MOTION authorizing the Executive to submit grant applications to the Washington State Department of Ecology to fund projects to improve water quality in King County.

WHEREAS, the Washington State Legislature has created the Centennial Clean Water Fund for the joint funding of water quality improvement activities and facilities with other public agencies in the state pursuant to Chapter 70.146 RCW, and WHEREAS, the Washington State Legislature has required the development of the 1987, 1989 and 1991 Puget Sound Water Quality Management Plans that require local governments to conduct certain planning and implementation activities related to preserving or improving water quality in Puget Sound and in water tributary to Puget Sound, and

WHEREAS, the Washington State Department of Ecology has invited eligible project sponsors to submit proposals for Centennial Clean Water Fund grants for fiscal year 1993, and

WHEREAS, \$52,500,000 in total funds will be available for a variety of water pollution control facilities and activities, and

WHEREAS, the state grant share generally will be 50 to 75 23 24 percent of the total eligible cost of a project, and WHEREAS, eligible projects include: water pollution 25 control facilities and activities that are on freshwater lakes 26 27 and rivers including lake restoration projects; water pollution control facilities and activities that address non-point source 28 pollution, including watershed planning and implementation; 29 groundwater facilities and activities; and discretionary 30 projects that may not qualify in other funding categories and 31 that address water quality, and 32

33 WHEREAS, applications will be accepted by the Washington 34 State Department of Ecology until February 21, 1992, and WHEREAS, the Washington State Department of Ecology will formally offer financial assistance to the highest priority ranked proposals in July, 1992, and

WHEREAS, no single government entity may receive more financial assistance in a funding category than the ceiling specified for that category in Chapter 70.146 RCW, and

WHEREAS, for the purposes of Centennial Grant proposals, the Washington State Department of Ecology has recognized the Seattle/King County health department as a separate government entity and not subject to the King County ceiling;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County: A. The county executive is hereby authorized to develop and submit to the Washington State Department of Ecology proposals for water quality activities and facilities as described in Attachment A.

B. The county executive is hereby authorized to determine in each funding category the priority of all proposals for which a preliminary offer of financial assistance is made so that the ceiling amount for that category is not exceeded.

C. The county executive is hereby authorized to negotiate agreements with the Washington State Department of Ecology to accept grant funding for activities and facilities receiving final offers of financial assistance in fiscal year 1993 from the Washington State Department of Ecology.

D. Agreements to accept grant funding which are negotiated shall not be executed by the county executive until approved by motion of the Council.

E. The Director of the Seattle/King County health department is requested to explore all possible alternative funding sources for that portion of required grant matching funds that would exceed the current CX funding level for the department's groundwater programs.

F. Council authorization of grant applications does not constitute a committment to provide CX funding at levels projected in the applications.
