MOTION NO. -8615

A MOTION initiating the Federal Way Community Plan Update, describing the scope of the Update and establishing the responsibilities of a community plan update citizens advisory committee and the King County planning and community development division in updating the existing Federal Way Community Plan and approving the appointment of citizens to serve on the Federal Way Community Plan Citizens Advisory Committee.

WHEREAS, the King County Council adopted the Updated Federal Way Community Plan and Area Zoning in September 1986.

WHEREAS, the City of Federal Way encompasses a substantial portion of the Federal Way planning area, incorporated on February 28, 1990.

WHEREAS, there are land use areas between the Federal Way city limits and the Cities of Algona, Auburn, Des Moines, Kent, Milton and Pacific that are in unincorporated King County.

WHEREAS, this unincorporated area is designated in the King County Comprehensive Plan as Urban, and the area includes sensitive areas and resource lands which require protection.

WHEREAS, the Federal Way Community Plan does not include policies addressing the provision of urban services and annexation.

WHEREAS, the State Growth Management Act requires cities and counties to identify urban growth boundaries and 5 7 4 6 urban separators.

WHEREAS, King County Comprehensive Plan policy PI-304 calls for King County to work with cities to identify future annexation areas, and states that interlocal agreements should be used to ensure consistent land use policies and public improvement standards within the agreed upon annexation areas.

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WHEREAS, elected officials of King County, the Cities of Algona, Auburn, Des Moines, Federal Way, Kent, Milton and Pacific have met to discuss issues of mutual concern relating to the unincorporated Federal Way planning area, and recommended a Citizens Advisory Committee be selected.

WHEREAS, the King County Executive, the Councilmember from district 7, and mayors of the above cities have identified citizens to serve on the Federal Way Community Plan Update Citizens Advisory Committee.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The Federal Way Community Plan Update and Area Zoning shall incorporate and implement relevant policies, map designations and concepts of the 1985 King County Comprehensive Plan. Specifically, the Federal Way Community Plan Update shall consider and address:

1. The 1990 Washington State Growth Management Act;

2. Regional plans and intergovernmental agreements, as applicable;

3. Policies of the 1985 King County Comprehensive Plan;

4. Revisions to the plan policies and zoning;

5. Issues of mutual interest between King County and adjacent jurisdictions, such as land use, facility planning, development standards, environmental protection, affordable housing and future annexation areas which may be further addressed in subsequent interlocal agreements;

6. Boundaries of water and sewer service areas, and adequacy of water supply necessary to implement plan policies;

7. Compatibility between King County plans and adopted plans of adjacent jurisdictions and special purpose districts to assure the ability of service providers to

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adequately serve the proposed land use and projected growth, including schools and other community facilities;

8. Environment and open space, including protection of fish and wildlife habitat, environmentally sensitive areas, surface and ground water management needs, and water quality;

9. Protection from flooding, improvement and enhancement of aquatic habitat and water quality of the Hylebos Basin through implementation of recommendations in the Hylebos Basin Plan;

10. The need, adequacy, timing, and financing of transportation facilities and other infrastructure elements required to support proposed commercial, industrial and residential developments.

11. Opportunities for residential development to accommodate anticipated population at appropriate densities and locations, considering factors such as existing subdivision patterns, environmental constraints, availability and capacity of public services, and compatibility with adjacent uses; and

12. The identification of Urban Separators and urban growth area boundaries for the Cities of Algona, Auburn, Des Moines, Federal Way, Kent, Milton and Pacific.

B. The Parks, Planning and Resources Department in consultation with other key County Departments and affected cities, shall develop area zoning to implement the proposed policies. The proposed area zoning should include:

 Maps and descriptions of the zoning classifications necessary to implement the recommended policies and land use designations;

2. Special development conditions necessary to protect the environment, mitigate significant adverse environmental impacts, phase development to link growth with

infrastructure availability and avoid urban sprawl and otherwise carry out the recommended land use policies; and

3. Clear and concise text explanations for the applied zoning classifications.

BE IT FURTHER MOVED by the Council of King County:

The Cities of Algona, Auburn, Des Moines, Federal Way, Kent, Milton and Pacific are hereby requested to consider action on resolutions committing to similar intent and a cooperative planning effort.

BE IT FURTHER MOVED:

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A. There is established a nine member Federal Way Community Plan Update Citizens Advisory Committee, composed of the individuals listed in attachment A.

B. Committee members are expected to serve for the duration of the planning process to ensure the final recommendations are made by individuals who have participated in review of all issues. In the event a member is unable to complete his or her term, the department may recommend to the King County Executive and the Councilmember from district 7 a replacement if necessary to complete the advisory committee's work.

C. All committee members shall be subject to the disclosure provisions of K.C.C. 3.04.050.

D. As their first order of business at their second meeting, the committee shall elect a chairperson, and

E. The chairperson's role and responsibility is to attend all committee meetings; provide the opportunity for each committee member to express his/her viewpoints; work with staff to assure agendas are accomplished; facilitate and summarize discussions; and strive for consensus.

BE IT FURTHER MOVED:

A. The Planning and Community Development Division shall convene the Federal Way Community Plan Update Citizens

Advisory Committee, herein after referred to as the Committee, and familiarize the Committee with the planning process and existing King County policy. The Committee shall provide a community assessment of issues, concerns, strengths and weaknesses of the area. If the Committee determines a community profile which includes information about the existing conditions within the plan update boundaries is warranted, this community assessment shall be incorporated into the community profile.

B. Development of the Federal Way Community Plan Update shall proceed as follows:

1. The King County Planning and Community Development Division staff shall be responsible for preparing the Executive proposed Federal Way Community Plan Update documents. Throughout the planning process, planning staff shall be responsible for incorporating the recommendations of the Committee, the views of the cities and of the general public into the Executive Proposed Federal Way Community Plan Update documents. Planning staff shall be responsible for staffing the Federal Way Community Plan Citizens Advisory Committee meetings, including preparing agendas, and maintaining schedules.

2. The Committee shall consider the local community's role and responsibilities within the context of the broader, Countywide community. Since one of the purposes of the Committee is to provide a vehicle for bringing together diverse interests within the Federal Way planning area, the Committee shall seek, encourage and facilitate broad community involvement. The Committee's responsibilities include: a) examining the impacts of local decisions on Countywide growth management strategies and initiatives; b) examining criteria and designations for urban separators; c) reviewing designation of urban growth areas; d) developing

and approving utility and annexation recommendations concerning urban growth areas; and e) making policy and land use designation recommendations.

3. The Committee shall review work of the planning staff, consider comments from the general community and technical experts, and advise staff in resolving issues identified in the profile and developing proposed policies.

4. Regular Committee meetings shall end after the Executive has transmitted his recommended plan to the King County Council. Committee members are encouraged to continue to participate in the public review process by the King County Council to assure that the community's interests are reflected in the adopted plan chapters, area zoning and implementation measures.
