MOTION NO.

A MOTION authorizing the King County Executive to negotiate a lease with the King County Library System to place a library in Richmond Beach Center Park.

WHEREAS, the King County council previously has determined that the development of a library in Richmond Beach Center Park would provide enhanced recreational benefits by allowing users to enjoy the benefits of both park and library services on the same visit, and

WHEREAS, over 2000 residents of the Richmond Beach area have expressed support for the development of the library in the park, and

WHEREAS, the King County council, by Motion 7885, passed on April 9, 1991, requested the King County executive to negotiate an agreement with the King County Library System (KCLS) allowing the development of a library in Richmond Beach Center Park, and

WHEREAS, the King County council, by Motion 8332 passed on July 8, 1991, authorized the King County executive to enter into an interlocal agreement with KCLS for development of a library in Richmond Beach Center Park, and

WHEREAS, King County and KCLS negotiated an agreement which was reviewed and approved by the King County Prosecutor resulting in the expenditure of public funds by KCLS for design of a library in Richmond Beach Center Park, and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the approval of the interlocal agreement with the KCLS, the King County prosecuting attorney again reviewed the agreement and advised that the agreement contained certain limited legal defects requiring legal remedies, and

WHEREAS, the executive, upon the advice of the prosecuting attorney, informed the KCLS that King County considered the agreement void because of non-compliance with procedures to

surplus property and because the park had been purchased with proceeds of Forward Thrust Bonds requiring that the park not be used other than for parks and recreation purposes unless other

WHEREAS, the KCLS is willing to provide land of equivalent value in order to meet the conditions required by Forward Thrust Bonds, and

equivalent lands and facilities were received in exchange, and

WHEREAS, the Richmond Beach Community currently has over 127 acres of parkland, a ratio 10.4 acres per 1,000 people, well above the 5 acres per 1,000 people service level recommended by King County Parks in their 1987 Interim Assessment of Park Needs, and

WHEREAS, the surplussing of .67 acre of the 4-acre
Richmond Beach Center Park for the 35-year lease term to
accommodate the library would not significantly impact current
park activities such as t-ball and other park uses, and

WHEREAS, the King County council and executive have approved the location of other valuable public uses in parks through interlocal agreements, including but not limited to agreements with the Maple Valley Community Center, Maple Valley Historical Society, Southwest King County Arboretum, the Lake Washington Youth Soccer Association, and the KCLS for a library in Ober Park on Vashon Island, and

WHEREAS, as a matter of policy, the King County council has twice previously expressed strong support for the location of a library in Richmond Beach Center Park consistent with its historical and traditional site as a location for multiple public use facilities;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The King County executive is hereby requested, in cooperation with the Prosecuting Attorney, to negotiate a lease with the King County Library System that would allow for the construction of a library in Richmond Beach Center Park. The council suggests the executive use the following elements when

A. Declare as temporarily surplussed to the County's parks needs that portion of the park property which is necessary to construct the library, including but not limited to, parking B. Lease to the Library System the portion of the property C. Receive lands of equivalent value from KCLS in order to satisfy the covenants of Forward Thrust Bonds. In addition, the executive is requested to present to the council, on or before July 15, 1992, a proposed lease, together with proposed ordinances or motions which may be required, to provide for development of a library on a portion of lands presently occupied by Richmond Beach Center Park.
