

MOTION NO. 8748

A MOTION authorizing the county executive to enter into agreements with the King Consortium agencies to exchange Surface Transportation Program (STP) funds and to facilitate transportation improvements in King County.

WHEREAS, the Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) has approved the distribution of federal fiscal year (FFY) 1992 Surface Transportation Program (STP) funds "in an amount equal to and by the same procedures as the FFY 1991 Federal-Aid Urban System (FAUS) funds were distributed", and

WHEREAS, the King Consortium FAUS Advisory Committee (CFAC) was established by the Puget Sound Council of Governments (PSCOG) and recognized by the Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) to represent the King Consortium of 24 local governments in King County on matters concerning the Federal-Aid Urban System Program, and

WHEREAS, the CFAC has approved allocation of the FFY 1992 STP funding of \$2,813,575 as shown on the attached EXHIBIT E, and

WHEREAS, the CFAC is required to submit a list of King Consortium's STP projects and its STP fund allocations, including the Commute Trip Reduction Project funding of \$280,000 to the Transportation Policy Board of the PSRC as soon as possible, and

WHEREAS, the CFAC allocation results in a level of STP funding for some small Consortium agencies that is not adequate to support a federal-aid project within the procedural requirements set by the Federal Highway Administration, and

WHEREAS, some of the small Consortium agencies desire to exchange STP funds with King County in order to make transportation improvements in their jurisdictions that would not qualify as federal-aid highway projects, and

WHEREAS, the King County Roads Capital Improvement Program could make use of additional federal STP funds, and

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1 WHEREAS, since King County would not be in a position to obligate the  
2 additional federal STP funds for two years, inflation would be considered in  
3 setting a discount rate for the exchange;

4 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

5 A. The county executive is hereby authorized to negotiate STP fund  
6 exchanges with interested King Consortium agencies to expedite and ensure  
7 timely STP fund obligation and to promote transportation improvements in King  
8 County.


9 B. The county executive is hereby authorized to enter into agreements  
10 with interested King Consortium agencies for the exchange of King County's  
11 road fund monies for the local agencies' allocated STP funds in order to  
12 support the local agencies' small transportation improvement projects;

13 C. Any such agreements should provide that county road fund monies be  
14 provided at a discounted rate set to reflect the impact of inflation during  
15 the period elapsing before the county is able to obligate the STP funds  
16 exchanged.

17 D. The county executive is also hereby authorized to enter into and  
18 execute such subcontracts as are necessary for the implementation of this  
19 project.
