A MOTION authorizing the King County executive to make a grant application for funds in the amount of \$3,222,384 for the period April 1, 1993 through March 31, 1998 to evaluate the effectiveness of the Seattle Needle Exchange Program.

WHEREAS, the National Institute on Drug Abuse (National Institutes of Health) is authorized to make grants of funds to evaluate outreach/intervention programs for injection drug users, and

WHEREAS, the AIDS epidemic continues to impact King County citizens engaging in injection drug use, and

WHEREAS, the Seattle King County department of public health has had a needle exchange program in effect since April, 1989, and

WHEREAS, the results of a needle exchange program evaluation will provide important information regarding the effectiveness of needle exchange programs that can be used locally and nationally and may help to prevent the further spread of HIV, and

WHEREAS, the evaluation will provide unique guidance in the development of service and prevention efforts for communicable diseases, drug use, and other public health concerns in a hard to reach population, and

WHEREAS, the council recognizes that the funds secured through an approval of the application by the National Institute of Drug Abuse will support the entire cost of the evaluation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the council of King County:

- A. The King County executive is hereby authorized to make application for funds in the amount of \$3,222,384 to the National Institute of Drug Abuse to support the evaluation of the needle exchange program;
- B. The King County executive is hereby authorized to file and execute such application and to enter into and execute such contracts as are required by the grantor;
- C. The King County executive is hereby authorized to file and execute such sub-contracts as are necessary for the implementation of the project;
