MOTION NO. 8844

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3 A MOTION authorizing the King County Executive to
4 negotiate a three-year interlocal cooperation agree-
5 ment with suburban cities for the purposes of adminis-
6 tering the Community Development Block Grant and other
7 federal grants from the United States Department of
8 Housing and Urban Development and specifically
9 directing the Executive to work with the cities to
10 identify any housing and community development needs
11 that are best addressed on a regional basis, and to
12 negotiate the agreement accordingly.

14 WHEREAS, the King County Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)
15 Consortium is a legal entity organized to receive and administer federal CDBG
16 and other housing and community development grants from the United States
17 Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) on behalf of participating
18 jurisdictions, and

20 WHEREAS, participating jurisdictions currently include King County and
21 twenty-six of the suburban cities in King County, and

22
23 WHEREAS, these participating jurisdictions periodically renegotiate and
24 sign a HUD-required three-year interlocal cooperation agreement which outlines
25 the basis upon which the county and participating cities agree to cooperate to
26 receive and administer these federal funds in order to address housing and
27 community development needs, and

28
29 WHEREAS, King County as the lead agency in a consortium with twenty-six
30 cities and towns is entitled to approximately \$5,587,850, and

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32 WHEREAS, some housing and community development needs may be best
33 addressed on a regional (consortium-wide) or subregional basis, and others may
34 be best addressed on a local (individual jurisdiction) basis, and

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36 WHEREAS, the interlocal cooperation agreement, by specifying how funds
37 are to be distributed among consortium partners, in effect dictates whether
38 funds are available to address needs on a regional basis, a local basis, or
39 both, and

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41 WHEREAS, the current agreement makes no CDBG funds available on a
42 consortium-wide basis other than the minimum needed for administration, and

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44 WHEREAS, community development should focus on all aspects of

1 development including land use, housing, public improvements, capital
2 facilities, and public services, and

3 WHEREAS, the urbanized areas across the county have different low-income
4 development needs than the rural areas in the county, and

5 WHEREAS, the requirements of growth management promote coordination of
6 regional planning and development resources, and

7 WHEREAS, this agreement must be renegotiated for the 1994-1996 period to
8 receive federal funds as an urban county;

9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:


10 The King County executive is authorized to negotiate a three-year
11 interlocal cooperation agreement for the 1994-1996 period.

12 BE IT FURTHER MOVED,


13 The executive is directed to explore with the cities whether or not
14 there are housing and community development needs in the consortium that are
15 best addressed on a regional and/or subregional basis and, if so, how housing
16 and community development funds can best be made available to address these
17 needs.
