MOTION NO. 8899 _

A MOTION related to implementation of the monitoring and enforcement of acquired farmlands development rights and agricultural advocate and support elements of the King County Farmlands and Open Space Preservation Program.

WHEREAS, the management audit of the Farmlands and Open Space Preservation Program identified the lack of a formal monitoring and enforcement program for the development rights acquired by King County, and

WHEREAS, the agricultural support elements mandated under the Farmlands Preservation Program have not been implemented, and

WHEREAS, the executive response to the audit concurred with the recommendations and indicated that the property services division, department of executive administration, will assume the responsibilities for monitoring and enforcing the development rights acquired under the program. The response also indicated that the parks division, parks, planning and resources department, would retain the responsibilities for developing and updating regulations to protect agricultural areas and implementing policies through the county's comprehensive plan, and, together with the King county Cooperative Extension Program, would coordinate county agricultural support activities and develop programs to enhance the continued viability of agriculture in the county, and

WHEREAS, the council chair requested the executive to prepare an implementation plan addressing policies and procedures, and the manner in which these policies and procedures will be implemented, specific roles and responsibilities of various positions and agencies, and the schedule for which the plan will be implemented, and

WHEREAS, the county auditor's office has received the implementation plan from the property services division

addressing progress to date and the work plan for monitoring and enforcement of development rights acquired by the county;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. The King County council reaffirms its position of placing a priority on protecting the development rights acquired by the county.
- B. The King County council accepts and adopts the attached implementation plan for the property services division to monitor and enforce the deed and agreement relating to development rights entered into for the properties on which the county acquired development rights.
- C. The executive is directed to prepare and submit for council consideration an amendment to Ordinance No. 7889 (King County Code Section 2.16.050 A) to reflect the assumption by the property services division of responsibility for policy development and records management practices to protect the county's development rights which were formerly assigned to the parks division.
- D. The property services division, through the executive is requested to submit to the council's Parks, Open Space and Natural Resources Committee, or its successor, an annual report, by no later than March 31 of each following year, detailing the monitoring and enforcement activities, including the sites inspected, the current agricultural or open space use, permit activities, violations noted and manner in which the violations were resolved.

BE IT FURTHER MOVED THAT:

- A. The King County council also reaffirms its position of supporting the agricultural community, the viability of agricultural activities in King county, and promotion of the county's agricultural programs.
- B. The parks division, through the executive, is directed to prepare a detailed plan for developing and updating regulations to protect agricultural support activities and

developing programs to enhance the continued viability of 2 agriculture in the county. C. The executive is directed to form a committee 3 4 consisting of, at minimum, representatives of property services division, Cooperative Extension Program and parks division, to 5 plan, coordinate and communicate the regulatory review and 6 7 agricultural support activities of the county. D.
