MOTION NO. 8973

A MOTION requesting the Executive  
reactivate the boating advisory  
commission as established in K.C.C.  
12.44.550.

WHEREAS, one out of five Washington State households owns  
at least one type of watercraft, and

WHEREAS, this represents 205,146 boats in King County, and

WHEREAS, this increase in boat ownership and the resulting  
increase in recreation activities on our waterways has created  
increased safety and law enforcement concerns, and

WHEREAS, K.C.C. 12.44.550 originally adopted as Resolution  
28232 (1964) and amended in Ordinance 1008 (1971), established  
a boating advisory commission, and

WHEREAS, K.C.C. 12.44.550 specified that the commission be  
composed of such members as may be selected by the county  
executive and approved by the county council, and

WHEREAS, presently there is no operating boating advisory  
commission;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The county executive is requested to reactivate the  
boating advisory commission as established in K.C.C. 12.44.550  
and appoint an appropriate number of members representing both  
salt and fresh waterfront communities in unincorporated King  
County, commercial recreational boating interests, water sports  
enthusiasts, and other persons with interests in the promotion  
of safe boating recreation activities.

1 B. The Executive is requested to appoint appropriate  
2 County staff personnel to serve as ex-officio members of the  
3 commission.
