A MOTION authorizing applications for funding assistance for outdoor recreation and habitat conservation projects to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.

WHEREAS, King County has approved an "Open Space Plan" identifying trails, natural areas and greenbelts which are needed to develop a quality park and open space system, and

WHEREAS, the county is in the process of completing a comprehensive park and recreation plan, and

WHEREAS, under the provision of the Marine Recreation Land Act or the Washington Wildlife Recreation Program, state and federal funding assistance may be authorized for financing the acquisition of parks and habitat conservation areas and the construction of public outdoor recreational facilities;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the King County Council:

A. The King County executive is hereby authorized to make formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for funding assistance through the 1995 grant cycle for the following projects:

- B. When further information is available regarding the 1995 funding cycle for Interagency Committee grants, the executive is requested to obtain approval from the Utilities and Natural Resources Committee before submitting grant applications for specific projects.
- C. King County hereby certifies that, if a specific project grant is accepted, the county will fully support its grant match commitments.

- D. Any property acquired with financial aid through the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation shall be used as an outdoor recreation area or habitat conservation area and be retained in such use in perpetuity unless otherwise provided and agreed to by the King County Council, the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation, and any affected federal agency.
- E. This motion shall be part of the formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.
- F. The office of open space has given adequate notification and opportunity for public input and published notices identifying affected flood plains and/or wetlands, if applicable.
- G. King County hereby certifies that the county is owner of lands to be developed based on current knowledge and provides assurance there are no encumbrances on such lands which would restrict the recreation or habitat conservation use of the land as proposed in this application.
