MOTION NO. 9297

A MOTION requesting the executive to work with suburban cities to amend the solid waste and interlocal forum interlocal agreements.

WHEREAS, interlocal agreements were executed in 1988 between King County and the cities located within the county for the purpose of establishing county and city responsibilities for solid waste planning, collection, transfer and disposal and creating the Solid Waste Interlocal Forum (Forum) to provide interjurisdictional policy guidance to the county on solid waste issues, and

WHEREAS, the Forum established by interlocal agreement has not achieved a quorum for two years, and

WHEREAS, discussions between King County and the cities during the regional governance summits which proposed the formation of interjurisdictional regional policy committees of the King County Council included consideration of abolishing the Forum and replacing its functions with a regional policy committee of the council, and

WHEREAS, the voters of King County have approved charter amendments which provide for interjurisdictional regional policy committees of the King County council,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The executive is authorized to initiate discussions with the city of Seattle and suburban cities to amend the solid waste and interlocal forum interlocal agreements for the express and limited purpose of dissolving the Forum and, in its place, referring policies related to rates for solid

2 plan to the Regional Policy Committee of the Metropolitan  
3 King County council for review and consideration by  
4 interjurisdictional elected officials, as appropriate.
