MOTION NO. 9305

A MOTION authorizing the county executive to enter into an amendment to an interlocal agreement with the city of Woodinville relating to law enforcement services.

WHEREAS, The City of Woodinville desires to enter into an amendment to an existing interlocal agreement for law enforcement administrative support, and

WHEREAS, local 519, representing law enforcement captains and lieutenants, has a complaint pending with the Public Employment Relations Commission which involves the county, and

WHEREAS, a decision on this issue is unlikely before late 1994, and

WHEREAS, the city and county desire to move ahead with services requested, and

WHEREAS, the county is able and willing to provide the requested supplemental law enforcement administrative support services, and

WHEREAS, it is the present policy intent of the council that in the event an adverse ruling is issued by the Public Employment Relations Commission, the County will absorb resulting cost differences for the remainder of 1994, and

WHEREAS, while it is the intent of the council to absorb such costs in 1994, the parties understand that the county does not necessarily agree to absorb future cost increases as a result of mandated staffing levels at Woodinville, and such

1 increases, if any, will be the subject of future negotiations
2 between the parties;

3 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King
4 County:

5 The county executive is authorized to execute an
6 amendment to an interlocal agreement, substantially in the
7 form attached, with the city of Woodinville for the county to
8 provide supplemental law enforcement services.

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**Amendment to Interlocal Agreement
City of Woodinville and King County, Washington
Relating to Law Enforcement Services**

WHEREAS, the King County (hereafter County) and the City of Woodinville (hereafter City) have an agreement whereby the County, for an agreed upon fee, provides law enforcement services to the City of Woodinville, and

WHEREAS, that document provides, in Section 11, that the agreement may be amended at any time by mutual agreement, and

WHEREAS, the City desires to contract for supplemental law enforcement services, and the County has the resources to provide such supplemental services, and

WHEREAS, the County and the City wish to amend the contract to add additional sections;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms and conditions contained herein, it is mutually agreed by and between the County and the City that the Interlocal Agreement relating to Law Enforcement Services is amended as follows:

The following sections are added to the existing Law Enforcement Agreement:

16. Supplemental Services

16.1 The City agrees to purchase, and the County agrees to provide, for the exclusive use in the City, the following law enforcement position:

- a. One (1) full time Sergeant

17. Supplemental Services Compensation

17.1 Contract Amount. In consideration for the supplemental services provided by the County as set forth herein, the City agrees to pay the County the actual additional costs of providing the supplemental service, including but not limited to personnel, capital equipment and supplies. The estimated contract amount for 1994 is \$89,971 as shown in Exhibit II, attached. The exhibits shall be revised for each subsequent year in which supplemental services are purchased by the City.

17.2 Billing. The estimated contract amount will be billed in equal monthly amounts. Payments are due within 30 days after invoicing by the County.

17.3 Annual Adjustment. The annual contract amount for supplemental services will be adjusted based on the actual expenditures of the Department of Public Safety. The additional amounts or refunds will be due in April of the following year.

17.4 Adjustment for Discretionary Dispatch Calls. For compensation purposes, the

County agrees to reduce in its calculation the total amount of dispatched calls for service responded to by the supplemental position(s) for which the City is paying in full. Such adjustments will take place during the annual adjustment, as detailed in section 5.3 of the original contract.

- 17.5 Other. For the City's budget planning purposes, the County will transmit to the City on or about September 15 of each year an estimate of the next calendar year's contract amount. For the County's budget planning purpose, the City will transmit to the County on or about October 1 the estimated amount of supplemental services, if any, which the City wishes to purchase.
- 17.6 Termination. Upon termination of this contract, the County shall provide the City with the City's share of cars purchased plus any depreciation amounts deposited for those cars.

All other terms and conditions of the Interlocal Agreement regarding law enforcement services remain in full force and effect.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have caused this amendment to the Agreement to be executed.
