MOTION NO. 19482

A MOTION establishing and defining the composition and functions of the committees of the Metropolitan King County Council for 1995 and rescinding Motion 9207.

WHEREAS, the interests of the citizens of King County and the efficiency of the operations of the county council are best served by appointing the duties and responsibilities of the council among several committees.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. Motion 9207 is hereby rescinded.
- B. The council may go into committee-of-the-whole at any time. The committee-of-the-whole shall consider issues of interest to the entire council including the 1995 work program; appointments to the state legislature, to the executive branch, and to numerous boards and commissions; the annual legislative program; reports of the state and county auditors; agendas for council meetings; and other program and policy matters.
- C. The chair of the council shall appoint the chair, vice-chair, and the membership of the standing committees, and any special ad hoc committees with consent of a majority of the councilmembers.
- D. In the absence of the chair and vice-chair of a committee, a committee member, designated by the committee chair, may serve as chair of the meeting.

- E. The committees of the Metropolitan King County council and their respective functions are established as follows:
- 1. Budget and Fiscal Management Committee shall review and monitor the budget, including financial plans, revenues, expenditures, quarterly reports, and capital improvement programs; monitor the financial status of county funds and cable communications; consider and make recommendations on all supplemental appropriations; and consider and make recommendations on debt and investment proposals, levies, fees, and taxes.

In respect to consideration of the county's annual budget, all the members of the council not assigned to the Budget and Fiscal Management Committee will be considered exofficio members of the committee. The chair of the committee shall refer various portions of the budget to panels of members. The chair of the committee may employ the various standing committees as panels. The panels shall transmit their recommendations to all councilmembers for their consideration as regular or ex-officio members of the Budget and Fiscal Management Committee before the committee refers the budget to the full council.

2. Growth Management, Housing, and Environment

Committee shall consider and make recommendations on policies

relating to growth management, housing, zoning regulations,

comprehensive and community planning, environmental

protection, and DDES policies.

In respect to consideration of the annual update of the Comprehensive Plan, all the members of the council not assigned to the Growth Management, Housing, and Environment Committee will be considered ex-officio members of the committee. The chair of the committee shall refer various portions of the Comprehensive Plan to panels of members. The chair of the committee may employ the various standing committees as panels. The panels shall transmit their recommendations to all councilmembers for their consideration as regular or ex-officio members of the Growth Management, Housing, and Environment Committee before the committee refers the annual update of the Comprehensive Plan to the full council.

- 3. Law, Justice, and Human Services Committee shall consider and make recommendations on policies relating to public safety, adult detention, constitutional and human rights, discrimination, civil and criminal liability, ethics, campaign practices, juvenile justice programs, youth services, the superior and district courts, judicial administration, prosecuting attorney, and public defense; and consider and make recommendations on matters relating to personal and environmental health, mental health, developmental disabilities, alcoholism and substance abuse, emergency medical services, human services, women's programs and aging programs, and oversee implementation of the children and families initiative.
- 4. Management, Labor, and Customer Services Committee shall consider and make recommendations on policies relating to management organizational structure, customer service, and performance of county departments, including: Assessor, Personnel, Purchasing, Civil Rights and Compliance, Real Property Management, Capital Project Management, Computer, Telecommunications, General Services, Records and Elections,

Facilities Management and County Space Planning, Risk
Management, Personnel Benefits, Safety and Worker's
Compensation, Cooperative Extension Community Services;
consider and make recommendations on the annual audit
program; consider and make recommendations relating to labor
relations and act as the labor policy committee; consider and
make recommendations relating to municipal service contracts;
and consider DDES efficiency and customer services.

- 5. Transportation Committee shall consider and make recommendations on policies relating to transportation planning, roads and engineering, and public transportation.
- 6. Economic Development and Regional Governance
 Committee shall consider and make recommendations on Metro
 consolidation and on issues relating to regional governance,
 including the Puget Sound Regional Council, the State
 Legislature, the City of Seattle, Suburban Cities, special
 districts, the Boundary Review Board, non-utility annexations
 and incorporations, and interlocal agreements; and consider
 issues relating to economic development.
- 7. Utilities and Natural Resources Committee shall consider and make recommendations on policies relating to recreation programs, parks, open space, natural resources, agricultural lands, resource lands, and cultural resources; and consider and make recommendations on policies relating to solid waste disposal and recycling, surface water management, water quality, and utility service, including water and sewer service.
- 8. Unincorporated Affairs Committee shall consider, make recommendations and take public comment on King County motions and ordinances, which are effective in the

2	recommendations relating to the creation of community
3	councils and other unincorporated self government strategies
