A MOTION expressing support of the Puget Sound Car Wash Association Charity Car Wash Program and requesting the Executive to work cooperatively with the association to maximize county resources in addressing water quality issues associated with charity and residential car washes.

WHEREAS, the Puget Sound Car Wash Association represents car wash operators who have an interest in improving the water quality of Puget Sound, and

WHEREAS, youth, church, and school groups are involved in fundraising activities which often times include charity car washes in parking lots of area businesses, and

WHEREAS, soapy runoff from residential and charity car washing contains high contents of phosphates, flows into stormwater drains, and is ultimately discharged directly into Puget Sound, negatively impacting water quality, and

WHEREAS, the Puget Sound Car Wash Association is committing substantial financial resources for a water quality education program designed to assist charity organizations in fundraising, and

WHEREAS, King County, Bellevue and Seattle have targeted charity car washes for special educational programs designed to protect water quality, and
