2 A MOTION accepting a gift of one Glock  
3 semiautomatic weapon from the Mothers  
4 Against Violence in America to the King  
5 County department of public safety in  
6 their effort in fighting crime.  
7

8 WHEREAS, the Mothers Against Violence in America  
9 conducted a gun buy-back program in the Federal Way area  
10 where; they received stolen guns which were returned to their  
11 rightful owners, illegal guns were destroyed, and inoperable  
12 guns were destroyed, and

13 WHEREAS, during the gun buy-back program the Mothers  
14 Against Violence in America received a Glock semiautomatic  
15 9mm pistol (model 19, serial #XH725) which is in excellent  
16 condition and has an estimated value of not more than  
17 \$600.00, and

18 WHEREAS, the Mothers Against Violence in America will  
19 donate the weapon under the following conditions:

- 20 1. The Glock semiautomatic 9mm pistol (model 19,  
21 serial #XH725) must be used exclusively by the King  
22 County department of public safety; and  
23 2. The Glock semiautomatic 9mm pistol (model 19,  
24 serial #XH725) may not be resold, traded-in, or  
25 otherwise returned to the general public or to a  
26 private party or to a collector; and

2 3. At such a time when the Glock semiautomatic 9mm  
3 pistol (model 19, serial #XH725) is no longer  
4 needed by the King County department of public  
5 safety, then it must be destroyed, and

6 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King  
7 County: The King County Sheriff is authorized to accept the  
8 Glock semiautomatic 9mm pistol to be used exclusively by the  
9 King County department of public safety, not to be resold,  
10 traded-in, or otherwise returned to the general public, and  
11 until such a time when the weapon is no longer needed by the  
12 King County department of public safety, then it must be  
13 destroyed. The weapon will be used by the King County  
14 department of public safety in its fight against violence and  
15 protection of our neighborhoods.

17 December, 1995.
