## MOTION NO. 9725

A MOTION accepting a gift of one Glock semiautomatic weapon from the Mothers Against Violence in America to the King County department of public safety in their effort in fighting crime.

WHEREAS, the Mothers Against Violence in America conducted a gun buy-back program in the Federal Way area where; they received stolen guns which were returned to their rightful owners, illegal guns were destroyed, and inoperable guns were destroyed, and

WHEREAS, during the gun buy-back program the Mothers
Against Violence in America received a Glock semiautomatic
9mm pistol (model 19, serial #XH725) which is in excellent
condition and has an estimated value of not more than
\$600.00, and

WHEREAS, the Mothers Against Violence in America will donate the weapon under the following conditions:

- The Glock semiautomatic 9mm pistol (model 19, serial #XH725) must be used exclusively by the King County department of public safety; and
- 2. The Glock semiautomatic 9mm pistol (model 19, serial #XH725) may not be resold, traded-in, or otherwise returned to the general public or to a private party or to a collector; and

3. At such a time when the Glock semiautomatic 9mm pistol (model 19, serial #XH725) is no longer needed by the King County department of public safety, then it must be destroyed, and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County: The King County Sheriff is authorized to accept the Glock semiautomatic 9mm pistol to be used exclusively by the King County department of public safety, not to be resold, traded-in, or otherwise returned to the general public, and until such a time when the weapon is no longer needed by the King County department of public safety, then it must be destroyed. The weapon will be used by the King County department of public safety in its fight against violence and protection of our neighborhoods.

PASSED by a vote of 9 to 0 this 11th day of December, 1995.
