MOTION NO. **9888**

A MOTION relating to economic development and authorizing the development of a program utilizing the King County cable television system to disseminate information regarding job, career and training opportunities in industrial trades.

WHEREAS, the Manufacturing Industrial Council of King County was created by the Metropolitan King County Council to recommend strategies by which county government can support the Manufacturing Industrial Centers of King County designated by the Growth Management Planning Council, and

WHEREAS, members of the Manufacturing Industrial Council have identified a need to create greater public awareness of the family-wage job, career and training opportunities provided by skilled, industrial trades, and

WHEREAS, King County is developing a government access cable television system to be used to provide information of direct value to citizens that could be used to disseminate programming to highlight family-wage job, career and training opportunities in industrial trades, and

WHEREAS, programming that highlights family-wage jobs, career and training opportunities in industrial trades are of direct value to thousands of King County citizens, and

WHEREAS, representatives for local and state labor organizations and educational institutions express interest in working with the Manufacturing Industrial Council and King

1 County to develop such programming, and

2 WHEREAS, the production and dissemination of this
3 programming would fulfill provisions of the King County
4 Comprehensive Plan that require county government to initiate
5 and support programs for work force development that provide
6 economic opportunities for all King County residents;

7 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King
8 County:

9 The Metropolitan King County Council authorizes the
10 development of a program utilizing the King County cable
11 television system to produce and disseminate programming
12 about job, career and training opportunities in industrial
13 trades. The programming should attempt to highlight
14 individuals who are succeeding in industrial trades, and
15 should include information about programs and institutions
16 providing training necessary to succeed in industrial trades.
