

**SPECIAL PROJECTS PROGRAM
COMMUNITY ARTS INITIATIVE - SUMMARY RECOMMENDATIONS**

1. **Applicant:** King County Library - Carnation Allocation: \$500

Project: "Fourth of July Festival" The King County Library, Carnation, in partnership with the Carnation Community Association, will present a free, public performance for an estimated audience of 2,000 people. Performers to be announced, but may include Linda Severt, Global Kids or Jim Valley.

2. **Applicant:** King County Library - Woodinville Allocation: \$700

Project: "Musical Sundays at the Woodinville Library" The King County Library, Woodinville, in partnership with the Friends of the Library, will present the first in a series of five free, public concerts to be held on Sunday afternoons in the main room of the library. The first performance is tentatively scheduled for October, with the Suffering Gaels.

3. **Applicant:** Burien Arts Association Allocation: \$1,050

Project: "Burien Strawberry Festival Big Band Event" The Burien Arts Association will present a free, public performance and dance, featuring music by The Kings of Swing to coincide with the annual Strawberry Festival of the Arts, June 28 and 29, 1997, at the Highline Community Center. The festival is a community based event, supported by the City of Burien, Burien Little Theatre, Choral Sounds Northwest, the Northwest Symphony Orchestra, the Burien Heritage Society, and others, and is staffed and managed entirely by volunteers.

4. **Applicant:** Duvall Cultural Resources Board Allocation: \$2,750

Project: "Sandblast '97" The Duvall Cultural Resources Board will present the third annual community art project on the banks on the Snoqualmie River in McCormick Park, on July 2-4, 1997. The funds will be used to support artist fees for Kali Bradford, a sand artist who will construct a monumental sand sculpture and coach community members, and to support artist fees for three bands (to be selected from the KCAC Touring Arts Roster) to give live "Music in the Park" performances during the event, which is free and open to the public. It is also a participatory event, and community members are encouraged to dig in and create their own sand sculptures or observe. The project has the cooperation of the Chamber of Commerce and local businesses, which provide substantial in-kind support for the event.

5. **Applicant:** City of Des Moines Park & Rec. Dept. **Allocation:** \$1,000

Project: "Family Fun in the Park Concert" The City of Des Moines Park & Recreation Department will present the second annual community concert to kick off the 38th annual Waterland Festival at Des Moines Beach Park on July 23, 1997. Funds will be used to support artist fees for Bochinché or Cornucopia Concert Band, pending availability and scheduling. The performance is free, and open to the public, and is supported with additional in-kind community contributions and staff support from the City of Des Moines.

6. **Applicant:** Friends of the Fall City Library. **Allocation:** \$1,250

Project: "Bochinché" The Friends of the Fall City Library will present a free, public performance featuring the popular Latin dance rhythms of Bochinché on June 14, 1997, in the park across from the library. Funds will be used to support artist fees, with additional in-kind community support from the staff of the library. KCAC support enables the Friends to present one of their largest musical ensembles to date. The Friends of the Library is the most active presenter of the arts in this community.

7. **Applicant:** City of Burien Parks & Rec. **Allocation:** \$1,000

Project: "Concerts in the Parks Program" The City of Burien Parks & Recreation Department will present Michael Powers (tentatively) in a free, open to the public outdoor performance on Sunday, July 20, 1997, at Lake Burien School Memorial Park. Another concert will be scheduled in late summer or early fall, and will also be free. The City of Burien Parks and Recreation Department has been supporting community activities since its inception four years ago, and partners with the Burien Arts Association and the Burien Little Theatre.

8. **Applicant:** Friends of the Fairwood Library **Allocation:** \$425

Project: "Arts Series" The Friends of the Fairwood Library will present free, public workshops for children ages 9-12, at the library. "Watercolor Illustration Workshop" led by artist Molly Hashimoto on September 13, will teach children the basics of watercolor, culminating in an exhibition of the children's work at the library. The "Book Arts Workshop" will provide the opportunity for 20 children to make a rice paste paper and traditional Japanese bound book in a workshop led by Rebecca Allen, scheduled for October 11, culminating in a display at the library. "Fun With Juggling" will present Linda Severt and Juggletunes to teach children of all ages the art of juggling in two workshops of 50 each; one for children ages 4-7, and the other for children ages 8-adult. Both programs are scheduled for February 21, 1998. All three programs are also supported by the Friends of the Fairwood Library.

9. **Applicant:** Maple Valley Library **Allocation:** \$450

Project: "Aesop's Fables" The Maple Valley Library will present a musical production of "Aesop's Fables" by the Thistle Theatre at the Maple Valley Community Center on Wednesday, September 24, 1997 -- an early release day for the Tahoma School District. The performance is expected to attract a large draw of school-age children and their parents. The performance is free and open to the public. The Community Center has donated space for the event, the library staff is providing in-kind support for this event, which ties into History Month at the library.

10. Applicant: Washington Games for Physically Disabled Children

Fall Concert in the Park Series -

King County Parks and Recreation Dept.

Allocation: \$13,875

Project: The following organizations and events are presented in collaboration with the King County Department of Parks and Recreation. This series of performing arts events will be presented in parks and community centers throughout suburban and unincorporated King County, targeting the residents of unincorporated King County. All performances are free and open to the public:

- "Washington Games for Physically Disabled Citizens" will present the Caribbean Superstars and Pete Leinonen Trio at Green River Community College on May 17, 1997. Collaborators include Green River Community College, Seattle Parks Dept., and the Kiwanis of Kent-Meridian.
- "Return to Newcastle" will present the Cornucopia Concert Band, the Sammamish Sublimation Band, and the Old Time Fiddlers at Cougar Mountain Wildland Park on June 1, 1997. Collaborators include the Issaquah Alps Trail Club, City of Newcastle, Newcastle Chamber of Commerce and Newcastle Rotary.
- "International Adventures - World Tour," will present six performances by musical ensembles reflecting international cultures (artists TBA) between July 16 and August 20, 1997, at Petrovisky Park, Fairwood; Lake Wilderness Park, Maple Valley; Si View Park, North Bend; Tolt McDonald Park, Carnation; Marymoor Park, Redmond; and Beaver Lake Park, Sammamish Plateau. Artists will be selected from the KCAC Touring Arts Roster. Collaborating partners include the King County Library System and the King County Summer Playgrounds and Camp Program.
- "Fall Concert Series" will present two concerts each of music representing various world cultures at these five locations on Saturdays and Sundays, from September - November, 1997: Fort Dent Park, Tukwila; Preston Community Center, Preston; Issaquah Lodge, Sammamish Plateau; and Lake Wilderness Center, Maple Valley. Artists will be selected from the KCAC Touring Arts Roster. The series is a new collaboration between King County Parks and the King County Library System.

11. Applicant: Planet Read - King County Library System
Adefua African Music and Dance Co.

Allocation: \$2,000

Project: "African Arts for All to See" The King County Library System developed "Planet Read" as a program to target area youth service centers to provide new learning opportunities for children and adults, by combining multicultural performances and interactive workshops. Additional support from KCAC will enable Adefua African Music and Dance Ensemble to present the full, six-member ensemble. These free, public performances will be presented May 30 through August 22, 1997, at the following venues.
