1 MOTION NO. 10259^A

2 A MOTION approving the county's long term space plan
3 (Plan) and authorizing the executive to execute the
4 implementing strategies outlined in the Plan, all subject to
5 council review and approval as appropriate.

6 WHEREAS, it has been determined that there is a need to seismically stabilize the
7 King County Courthouse, and

8 WHEREAS, the King County Executive and Council acknowledge that it is in the
9 best interest of the county to own rather than lease the majority of county occupied office
10 space in downtown Seattle, and

11 WHEREAS, a buttress addition to the courthouse provides seismic stability and an
12 economical method for acquiring required office space, and

13 WHEREAS, the opportunity exists to economically incorporate required
14 maintenance and corrective repair projects in the buttress addition project, and

15 WHEREAS, the opportunity exists to complete the historic restoration during the
16 buttress addition project, and

17 WHEREAS, the buttress seismic project which includes maintenance and historic
18 preservation elements has a total projected cost of eighty-eight million dollars and annual

1 net Current Expense Fund debt service costs of four million four hundred thousand dollars
2 within the financial planning period, such costs not as yet reflected in adopted county
3 financial plans, and

4 WHEREAS, this project will require a Certificate of Appropriateness from the
5 Landmarks and Heritage Commission, and

6 WHEREAS, this project will require approval from the City of Seattle relative to
7 the revised building footprint and resultant impact on City property, and

8 WHEREAS, the buttress seismic project will require detailed planning and
9 scheduling to allow continued operation of courthouse functions while meeting
10 construction project budget and schedule constraints, and

11 WHEREAS, the downtown space requirements of Public Safety require
12 consultation with the future elected Sheriff, and

13 WHEREAS, the discussions underway in the Regional Finance and Governance
14 Committee concerning county regional and local responsibilities will have some impact on
15 the long-range space plan but such recommendations are not due for final consideration by
16 the Growth Management Planning Council until October, 1997, and

17 WHEREAS, the county owned Kaplan/Tashiro building, if developed to its full
18 capacity, provides a future location for up to 142,800 square feet of office space or for
19 other county program purposes, and

20 WHEREAS, the King County Executive and Council desire departments to be
21 physically co-located as appropriate, and

1 WHEREAS, the King County Executive desires visible suburban King County
2 government office centers for those functions appropriately located outside of the City of
3 Seattle, and

4 WHEREAS, public health centers, police precincts and outlying offices, district
5 courts, youth and adult corrections, and other programs such as animal shelters are subjects
6 of other current or future space programming;

7 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

8 A. The council approves the policies and plans embodied in the attached
9 Summary: Long-Range Space Plan.

10 B. The council authorizes the executive to proceed with the buttressed courthouse
11 seismic stabilization project, including identified maintenance and corrective repairs and
12 historic renovation elements and with a total budget of eighty-eight million dollars,
13 provided that:

14 1. The executive shall provide a Current Expense Financial plan demonstrating
15 the ability to finance this project within current tax and revenue assumptions.

16 2. Prior to initiation of detailed design, but no later than requests for additional
17 project appropriations beyond the currently authorized budget of three million five hundred
18 thousand dollars, the executive shall provide for council review and approval a detailed
19 scope, budget, schedule, and implementation plan. This implementation plan shall:

20 a) Address the overall plan for management of the project including a
21 staffing plan and budget;

1 b) Incorporate the use of a Construction Management/General Contractor
2 approach per Ordinance 12224 to minimize construction risk and the requirement for
3 additional county management personnel;

4 c) Identify the method for coordinating project implementation concurrent
5 with requirements for courthouse operations, and establish the reporting mechanism to
6 track progress relative to budget and schedule;

7 d) Provide status of the City of Seattle's requirements for the project, with
8 agreement to such requirements requiring council approval if project scope or budget is
9 adversely impacted.

10 3. The executive shall work with the King County Landmarks and Heritage
11 Commission to ensure that the additions and renovations are completed in a manner
12 compatible with the historic character of the Courthouse. Specifically, the executive shall:

13 a) Submit conceptual designs for preliminary review to the Commission's
14 Design Review Committee and to the Pioneer Square Historic District;

15 b) Submit the final design for review to the Commission and to the Pioneer
16 Square Historic District;

17 c) Work in concert with the Commission to coordinate any historic
18 preservation review required by the City of Seattle;

19 d) Provide the council with a status of historic preservation review and
20 compliance; and

21 e) Work with the Commission to identify and apply for possible grant
22 funds for historic renovation.

1 C. The council supports the goal of reducing leased office space in downtown
2 Seattle to no more than 100,000 square feet.

3 D. The council supports reserving the Kaplan/Tashiro property in its current status
4 pending decisions on regional and local responsibilities, downtown space requirements of
5 Public Safety, and other non-office space county program facility requirements

6 E. The council requests that the King County Executive coordinate any leases or
7 purchases for services which could be impacted by local or regional assignments with the
8 Regional Finance and Governance Committee before recommending those leases or
9 purchases to the council.

10 F. The council requests that the King County Executive develop strategies to
11 enhance the visibility and presence of county agencies in suburban King County.

12 G. The council requests that the King County Executive coordinate other
13 programmatic space plans with the Long-Range Space Plan.


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1 H. The council requests that the King County Executive provide a Long-Range
2 Space Plan Update no later than March 1, 1998. This plan shall include:


- 3 1. The revisions resulting from annexations and incorporations which occurred
4 during the previous twelve months, and
5 2. The impacts from changes in governance, financing and service delivery
6 occurring as a result of the Growth Management Planning Council's Regional Governance
7 and Financing Plan.

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Summary: Long-Range Space Plan

Office (see Attachment A)

Policy Recommendations:

- *Move from high dependence on short-term leased space to owned space or leased space with option to own.*
- *Physically consolidate departments that were organizationally consolidated with the Metro/King County merger.*
- *Develop and maintain safe, attractive public buildings that create a good image for government and that are sound financial investments.*

Rationale:

Declining vacancy rates have caused office rental rates to soar into the low \$20/s.f. today and the prediction is that they will continue to increase for the next several years. What was a tenant's market has definitely become a landlord's market. The rates the County has enjoyed over the past several years (average of about \$13.50/s.f.) are no longer available, and it is becoming increasingly difficult to lease contiguous space in amounts large enough to physically consolidate agencies that need to be co-located.

Implementation Plan:

- Through a public/private partnership, enter into a lease-to-own contract for a new office building that will accommodate the Departments of Natural Resources and Transportation, reducing greatly our dependence on leased space and providing for physical consolidation.
- When DOT and DNR vacate space in County-owned buildings, move other agencies, who are also in leased space, into the vacated space in the Administration and Yesler Buildings.
- Seismically stabilize the Courthouse by buttressing it with an addition which will also provide about 110,000 more square feet of owned space.

Policy Recommendation:

Establish a stronger County presence in suburban King County.

Rationale:

As a regional government and as a local government to unincorporated areas, County government needs to have a better presence in the communities it serves and an identity outside of downtown Seattle.

Implementation Plan:

- Develop a South King County suburban campus, with DDES as the anchor tenant.

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- Move E-911/Com Center out of downtown Seattle to South King County with the Office of Emergency Management.
- Continue to develop Community Service Centers around the County.
- Continue to develop police storefronts around the County.
- Make decision on an Eastside Regional Justice Center.

Policy Recommendation:

Maintain a small percentage of County's space needs in leased space.

Rationale:

Since it is impossible to predict the exact amount of square footage the County will need over the next, say, twenty years, it makes sense to lease some space to account for short-term growth and shrinkage in certain programs and the changing technological or service requirements of other programs.

Implementation Plan:

Of the approximately 550,000 s.f. the County leases, keep not more than 100,000 s.f. in leased space.

Public Health Centers (see Attachment B)

Council Motion 8892 called for a Public Health Facilities Task Force to analyze and make recommendations on the County's Public Health Centers and Community Clinics in conjunction with Harborview Medical Center's facility needs. The Task Force has been established, is working to fulfill the Council's charge, and expects to make recommendations in early 1998. The Task Force is composed of representatives from the Public Health Department, the Council, and Harborview.

Police Precincts & Outlying Offices (see Attachment C)

Other than the offices and divisions now located in the Courthouse, which are dealt with under office space, we anticipate upgrades to existing facilities only and these upgrades can be dealt with in annual CIPS.

District Court (see Attachment D)

Council Motion 9913 requested an update of the District Court's Operational Master Plan. That update was forwarded to the Council in May of this year, with a recommendation to accept the report. Equitable cost sharing between the County and its contract cities is the major issue that should be resolved, if at all possible, before the County commits to constructing new facilities for those District Court Divisions most in need of them: Issaquah and Bellevue. Absent a commitment from the cities, a scaled back proposal for the divisions or a stay put for the next several years will likely be proposed. An Executive recommendation on the Issaquah Division should be forthcoming before the end of this year.

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Other (see Attachment E)

Animal Shelters:

South King County: Owned shelter in Kent is being upgraded with a new roof, improved HVAC, a new grooming area for dogs, and a new spay/neuter clinic among the most significant improvements. Project completion anticipated for the end of June.

Eastside: Leased facility. Decision to construct new facility deferred until a decision is reached about whether King County Animal Control is a *regional service* and therefore would receive some contribution from regional funding. This issue is now before the Regional Finance and Governance Task Force.

In order to provide a comprehensive look at the geographic locations from which the County provides services, Attachment E also lists, by Council District, the buildings and other facilities where the County has a presence, outside of the Courthouse Campus vicinity.

- Does not include Health Clinics/Centers, Correctional Facilities, Bus Bases, Treatment Plants, Airport, Police Precincts, District Courts, and the like.
- Some agencies' existing space in Administration Building should be reconfigured when agencies move out (former Public Works agencies) and agencies from former Metro move in (e.g. Finance) in addition to reconfiguring space for the new occupants.
- Agencies planned for continued leasing:
 - Boundary Review
 - Veterans' Aid & Public Defense in Pioneer Square
 - ITS/Key Tower
 - Aids & Alcohol/Substance Abuse Special Programs/Studies

- Space Plan originally envisioned Public Safety relocating to South King County Campus at Black River. Decision deferred. Administrative offices will stay in Courthouse for present. Evidence Storage, AFIS and associated labs have long-standing request to move because of very crowded conditions and must move under any seismic fix because of space lost on floor 1A of Courthouse. A specific proposal for their relocation will be forwarded to the Council soon. Com Center/911, 800MHz, Emergency Management are developing Facilities Master Plan for move to Roads Renton Shops Site.

The Sheriff's remaining in the Courthouse means the Courthouse Addition Project as presently sized, cannot accommodate both DIAS and CHS (22,945s.f. and 48,770s.f. respectively). One of these agencies could be accommodated in a redeveloped Tashiro Kaplan Building (scheme B). It is unlikely either could remain in space it currently leases.

Notes: A Public Health Facilities Task Force, established through Council Motion 8892, is evaluating the long-range facility Public Health Centers and Community clinics in conjunction with Harborview Medical Centers needs. A report is due early. Department wants to remain operational in all its current sites; however, the service mix may change. Depending on the specific community, changes in health status indicators, and available revenue base, population based services and primary care facilities may need to be configured differently. Major focus is needed on improvements in South King County facilities and on the 24-hour alcohol abuse facilities.

Notes:

- Generally, all District Courts complain of insufficient number of jury rooms (Jury trials have increased dramatically) of assembly space, insufficient storage space; inadequate space for administrative and support staff, lack of conference client and mediation activities; no space to accommodate small children who often disrupt court proceedings; inadequate of these needs can be accommodated by remodels, achieving a better layout.
- Maintenance needs can be addressed through annual CIPs.
- Technology upgrades should be addressed on a case-by-case basis.
 - If new District Courts are built, they should be sized to include "community service centers," providing licenses, property registration, assessor info., etc. Cities that contract with the DC do not share in facility costs. The county needs to share of the facility costs if it is to build new facilities.
 - The jurisdiction of the District Court system is likely to change. Jurisdiction may decrease as more cities elect to change and may increase in other instances, if there are jurisdictional changes between Superior and District Court.
