MOTION NO. 10386

A MOTION recommending against the establishment of a 311 non-emergency public service response telephone number system.

WHEREAS, on February 19, 1997, the Federal Communications Commission set aside 311 across the nation as the telephone number for people to call to access police or other local agencies for non-emergency help, and

WHEREAS, concern has been expressed about nationwide over-reliance on the existing E-911 emergency telephone number for non-emergency response purposes, prompting this FCC action, and

WHEREAS, in April, 1997, the council approved Motion 10197, providing for a feasibility study to determine if the implementation of a 311 non-emergency telephone access system in King County would be beneficial in reducing the number of inappropriate calls to 911, and

WHEREAS, such a study has been prepared and presented to the council, and among the findings of the study are that call volumes directed to the 911 system are not expected to exceed system capacity, and that, while there are certain areas where

inappropriate calls are excessive, only six percent of 911 calls in King County are 1 inappropriate calls, and 2 WHEREAS, the study has recommended that a 311 system should not be 3 implemented in King County at this time, given that the system is not currently 4 overburdened and that, with certain limited exceptions, the public generally uses the 5 system responsibly; 6 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County: 8 The county should not implement a 311 program at this time, but that the E-911 9 program office be directed to increase public education efforts on the appropriate use of 10 911 and seven-digit emergency numbers, and 11 the E-911 program office should continue to monitor the ongoing 311 evaluations 12 13 being conducted by others throughout the nation.
