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A MOTION establishing the 2000 state legislative agenda for King County.

WHEREAS, the metropolitan King County council and the King County executive have worked through the joint King County legislative steering committee to develop a state legislative agenda and desire to bring their positions on issues facing the 2000 Washington state legislature to the attention of the Washington state legislature, and

WHEREAS, King County desires to work cooperatively with other local governments and other organizations such as the Washington Association of County Officials, the Suburban Cities Association, the Association of Washington Cities, the Washington Transit Association and the Washington State Association of Counties to achieve its 2000 legislative goals, and

WHEREAS, counties have been recognized by the legislature as partners with the state in the delivery of such critical services as transportation, criminal justice, public health, community and human services, and water resources, and

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:


20 The King County council adopts the attached "King County Legislative Agenda -
