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17	WHEREAS, the Advancing Government Accountability's Citizen-Centric			
18	Government Reporting Initiative provides guidelines for government to report to their			
19	citizens how well their government operates and if their tax dollars are being spent			
20	efficiently and effectively, and			
21	WHEREAS, the Government Finance Officers Association's Popular Annual			
22	Financial Reporting Awards Program provides guidelines for government to report to its			
23	citizens on its financial statements;			
24	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:			
25	A. The county executive is requested to prepare the format for an annual "King			
26	County scorecard" and to transmit the report format to the council for its review by			
27	motion by July 1, 2008. The report should meet the following criteria:			
28	1. No longer than four pages;			
29	2. Visually appealing;			
30	3. Includes priorities of King County government;			
31	4. Understandable information is presented to citizens about the financial			
32	condition and performance of county government that answers the question "Are we			
33	better off today than we were last year?";			
34	5. Educates the citizens on the programs and services provided by the county,			
35	6. Available both in hard copy and on the Internet; and			
36	7. Meets the Advancing Government Accountability's Citizen-Centric Report			
37	guidelines.			

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38	B. The county executive is requested to prepare the format for an annual "state of		
39	King County government report" and to transmit the report format to the council for its		
40	review by motion by July 1, 2008. The report should meet the following criteria:		
41	1. Visually appealing;		
42	2. Understandable information is presented to citizens about the financial		
43	condition and performance of county government;		
44	3. Educates the citizens on the programs and services provided by the county		
45	and their cost;		
46	4. Available on the Internet;		
47	5. Able to be reported on the prior year to the public by May 1, 2009, based on		
48	adopted 2009 King County budget information; and		
49	6. Includes priorities of King County government.		
50	C. The county executive is requested to include the following data components in		
51	the annual "state of King County government report":		
52	1. Adopted budgeted and actual revenues for the county government as a whole		
53	and for the general fund and by major revenue source;		
54	2. Adopted budgeted and actual expenditures for the county government as a		
55	whole and for the general fund, by program area, by elected agency, executive		
56	department, division and appropriation unit; and		
57	3. Community and performance measures for the county as a whole, by program		
58	area, by elected agency, executive department and division.		
59	D. In an effort to make King County's financial statements easily understandable		
60	and accessible to the public, the executive is requested to participate in the Government		

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- 61 Finance Officers Association's Popular Annual Financial Reporting Awards Program
- 62 with the goal of achieving a certificate of achievement for excellence in financial
- 63 reporting program in 2009.
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- E. The report formats for the "King County scorecard" and the "state of King

65 County government report" shall be prepared jointly by the office of performance

66 management and the office of management and budget.
