1	A MOTION requesting the executive to research and report
2	to the council on the environmental, health and economic
3	benefits of expanding the county's environmentally
4	preferable purchasing program to include cleaning products
5	and cleaning methods.

7	WHEREAS, King County has been a strong leader on behalf of the
8	environment and has been committed to helping county agencies to purchase
9	environmentally preferable products that contain fewer toxic materials, minimize
10	waste, maximize recycling and conserve energy and other resources, and
11	WHEREAS, King County has demonstrable economic influence and
12	buying power, and
13	WHEREAS, in 1989 the county adopted a Recycled Produced
14	Procurement Policy directing county agencies to purchase recycled products
15	whenever practicable, and
16	WHEREAS, in 1995 the county expanded this policy and developed an
17	environmental purchasing program requiring county agencies to purchase

18	recycled and other environmentally preferable products whenever practicable and
19	directing agencies to purchase materials with lower toxicity that provide greater
20	conservation of energy, water and other resources, and
21	WHEREAS, in 2007 the county purchased 41 million dollars worth of
22	environmentally preferable products, and
23	WHEREAS, in 2007 the county saved and estimated \$877,000 by
24	purchasing environmentally preferable products, and
25	WHEREAS, in 2007, King County procurement and contract services section
26	solicited bids for cleaners that have been certified to meet the GS-37 standard set by
27	Green Seal, an organization that establishes consensus standards of environmental
28	performance, and
29	WHEREAS, in 2007, King County Metro transit started using environmentally
30	preferable cleaning products and methods and has reduced the amount of chemicals and
31	water needed to clean transit bases, bathrooms and offices, and
32	WHEREAS, the council wishes to ensure that all products purchases and
33	expenditures of public money are made in a manner consistent with the county's
34	human health and environmental policies, and
35	WHEREAS, the council wishes to reduce occupational health hazards for
36	county staff as well as reduce exposure of county residents and visitors to
37	potentially toxic chemicals, and
38	WHEREAS, the council wishes to reduce the environmental impacts of
39	toxic chemicals and conserve its natural resources, and

40	WHEREAS, the council finds it to be in the best interest of science, public
41	health, economics and the environment to investigate the benefits of
42	environmentally preferable cleaning products and methods for use in all
43	appropriate county facilities;
44	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:
45	A. The metropolitan King County council requests the executive
46	to research and report on the environmental, health and economic benefits
47	of expanding the county's environmentally preferable purchasing program
48	to include cleaning products and cleaning methods for all county agencies.
49	This report shall include a study on the feasibility of using
50	environmentally preferable cleaning products and cleaning methods at
51	different types of county facilities and properties including, but not limited
52	to:
53	1. General office space;
54	2. Public restrooms;
55	3. Health and human service clinics;
56	4. Housing facilities;
57	5. Public transportation vehicles;
8	6. Fleet vehicles, and
9	7. Community centers.

B. The executive's report should be transmitted by motion to the council by
August 15, 2008.
