1.	A MOTION requesting that the director of elections
2	develop and transmit a plan to improve access to and
3	convenience of ballot drop-off locations in King County.
4	WHEREAS, the King County Strategic Plan 2010-2014 includes the objective to
5	empower people to play an active role in shaping their future, via the strategy of
6	providing accurate, secure and accessible elections, and
7	WHEREAS, voter turnout in King County for the November 2015 general
8	election was historically low, at forty percent of registered voters, and
9	WHEREAS, voter turnout was also low, at twenty-five percent, in the August
10	2015 primary, and
11	WHEREAS, use of ballot drop-off locations has been above projections, at
12	approximately twenty percent of August primary ballots and twenty-six percent for the
13	November general election, demonstrating their popularity with voters, and
14	WHEREAS, the King County council passed Motion 12820 in July 2008
15	approving a plan for three regional voting centers and thirty-nine ballot drop boxes, but
16	only twenty-five ballot drop-off locations, including twelve temporary mobile van
17	locations with limited hours, were implemented in the November 2015 general election;
18	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County

19	A. The director of elections is requested to develop and transmit to the council a
20	plan to improve access to and convenience of ballot drop-off locations throughout King
21	County, including:
22	1. A proposed number of additional drop-off locations to ensure geographic
23	equity;
24	2. Proposed sites for the drop-off locations;
25	3. Estimated costs; and
26	4. An implementation timeline.
27	B. The plan should include an analysis of the feasibility and desirability of using
28	all public library locations in King County, including Seattle Public Libraries and the
29	King County Library System, as a means to ensure geographic equity and convenience
30	for voters.
31	C. The plan should include an option for deployment of the expanded drop boxes
32	for the November 2016 general election.
33	D. The director should transmit the plan by April 30, 2016, in the form of a paper
34	original and an electronic copy to the clerk of the council, who shall retain the original
35	and provide an electronic copy to all councilmembers, the council chief of staff, the

- 36 policy staff director and the lead staff for the government accountability and oversight
- 37 committee or its successor.
