1	A MOTION relating to the organization of the	
2	council; and amending Motion 11122, Section D, as	
3	amended, and OR 2-020.	
4	WHEREAS, the council has specified by motion the subject matters, chairs, vice-	
5	chairs and members of council committees and provided for any changes to these	
6	positions to be made by adoption of a formal legislative motion, and	
7	WHEREAS, the council desires to specify committee subject matter and	
8	membership;	
9	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:	
10	I. Motion 11122, Section D, as amended, and OR 2-020 are each hereby amended	
11	to read as follows:	
12	In addition to any committee otherwise established by law, the committees of the	
13	metropolitan King County council and their respective functions are established as	
14	follows:	
15	A. Budget and fiscal management committee shall consider and make	
16	recommendations on: the county revenue and expenditure fiscal structural gap; capital	
17	and operating budget appropriations; the sale and lease of real property to or by the	
18	county; debt and investment proposals; bond issues; the office of economic and financial	

19	analysis; and financial policies.	The committee shall also consider the implementation of
20	appropriate labor agreements.	

- 1. The committee shall develop recommendations on policy direction for the biennial budget, based on the recommendations of other council committees and taking into account the estimated fiscal impacts of state and federal legislation.
- 2. In respect to consideration of the county's proposed biennial budget, all members of the council not assigned to the budget and fiscal management committee shall be considered ex officio voting members of the committee.

B. Government accountability and oversight committee.

- 1. The committee shall consider and make recommendations on:
- a. improving the efficiency, cost effectiveness, and performance of all branches of county government (legislative, executive and judicial);
- b. enhancing oversight, accountability and transparency in King County government, the office of law enforcement oversight, the annual county audit program and federal, state or county audit reports, the administration of the Public Records Act, civil rights and compliance, capital projects oversight, strategic planning, performance measurement and performance management, management organizational structure and technology management; and
- c. general government oversight, including customer service, worker safety, the department of assessments; elections; records and licensing; animal control; cable communications; the county fair; King County international airport; risk management; veterans, and executive services such as telecommunications, facilities management, purchasing and real property management.

42	2. In the areas within the committee's purview, the committee shall track state
43	and federal legislative action and develop recommendations on policy direction for the
44	biennial budget.
45	C. Health, housing and human services committee.
46	1. The committee shall consider and make recommendations on policies relating
47	to:
48	a. public health programs, including those related to the protection, promotion
49	and provision functions of the department of public health, including the structure of the
50	public health centers;
51	b. affordable housing, including therapeutic and low-income housing; and
52	c. human services programs, including review of human services-related
53	levies, and civil rights and social justice. The committee shall also consider the
54	implementation of appropriate labor agreements.
55	2. In the areas within the committee's purview, the committee shall track state
56	and federal legislative action and develop recommendations on policy direction for the
57	biennial budget.
58	3. In respect to consideration of the best start for kids levy implementation plan
59	required by Ordinance 18088, Section 8.B., all members of the council not assigned to
60	the health, housing and human services committee also shall be members of the
61	committee. Only for those portions of a meeting when the committee considers that plan
62	shall these additional members be considered members of the committee for purposes of
63	quorum and attendance.
6/	D. Law and justice committee

65	1. The committee shall consider and make recommendations on policies relating
66	to law, safety, criminal justice and emergency management programs including those
67	related to: public safety; adult detention; juvenile justice and youth services; superior and
68	district courts; judicial administration; prosecuting attorney; public defense;
69	implementation of a pretrial risk assessment tool; emergency medical services;
70	emergency management, including disaster response, emergency preparedness and
71	emergency planning and the Puget Sound emergency radio network project.
72	2. In the areas within the committee's purview, the committee shall track state
73	and federal legislative action and develop recommendations on policy direction for the
74	biennial budget.
75	E. Transportation, economy and environment committee.
76	1. The committee shall consider and make recommendations on policies relating
77	to:
78	a. growth management, including land use development and regulation,
79	comprehensive planning, including implementation of its affordable housing elements,
80	economic development, including pay equity and income disparity, and annexations;
81	b. the environment, including: salmon recovery; resource lands; energy;
82	surface water management and water supply; wastewater treatment; solid waste;
83	unincorporated and rural areas, including agriculture and rural services; and parks,
84	recreation and cultural resources; and
85	c. transportation, including roads, passenger ferries and public transportation.
86	The committee shall also consider the implementation of appropriate labor agreements.
