1	A MOTION providing direction to the conservation futures
2	citizen oversight committee on priorities for allocating
3	conservation futures tax levy funds.
4	WHEREAS, RCW 84.34.010 declares that it is in the best interest of the state to
5	maintain, preserve, conserve and otherwise continue in existence adequate open space
6	lands for the production of food, fiber and forest crops and to ensure the use and
7	enjoyment of natural resources and scenic beauty for the economic and social well-being
8	of the state and its citizens, and
9	WHEREAS, RCW 84.34.210 authorizes the county to acquire property rights "to
10	protect, preserve, maintain, improve, restore, limit the future use of, or other otherwise
11	conserve, selected open space land, farm and agricultural land, and timber land," and
12	WHEREAS, property rights acquired under this authorization are defined as
13	conservation futures, and
14	WHEREAS, RCW 84.34.230 authorizes the use of a property tax levy to fund the
15	acquisition of conservation futures and the maintenance and operation of acquired
16	properties, and
17	WHEREAS, RCW 84.34.240 authorizes counties to establish a special
18	conservation futures fund to which the levy proceeds are credited, and

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19	WHEREAS, King County has established a conservation futures tax levy and
20	fund, and
21	WHEREAS, King County is required to establish a process to help ensure, over
22	time, that the distribution of the tax levy is throughout the county, and
23	WHEREAS, K.C.C. chapter 26.12 establishes an annual process for distribution
24	of the tax levy to acquire open space lands, including green spaces, greenbelts, wildlife
25	habitat and trail rights-of-way, and
26	WHEREAS, the process includes a citizen oversight committee that makes
27	project and funding allocation recommendations for each project to the executive, and
28	WHEREAS, the executive makes project and funding recommendations as part of
29	the budget process, and
30	WHEREAS, K.C.C. 26.12.010 allows the council to adopt a motion providing
31	direction to the conservation futures citizen oversight committee on priorities for
32	evaluating project applications, and
33	WHEREAS, K.C.C. 26.12.025 establishes criteria for conservation futures project
34	selection, which provides: "wildlife habitat or rare plant reserve; salmon habitat and
35	aquatic resources; scenic resources; community separator; historic or cultural resources;
36	urban passive-use natural area or greenbelt; park or open space system addition; and
37	transfer of development rights program implementation. Additional criteria may include:
38	passive recreation; education/interpretive opportunity; threat of loss of open space
39	resources; ownership complexity; partnerships; stewardship and maintenance; and any
40	other criteria consistent with RCW 84.34.020," and

41	WHEREAS, the North Lake-Hylebos watershed area and its surroundings in and
42	near the city of Federal Way provide discharge to Hylebos creek, and
43	WHEREAS, this area has been naturally revegetated with second growth timber,
44	which provides shade protection to North Lake and the East Hylebos Waterway, as well
45	as valuable habitat, and
46	WHEREAS, this area has provided a passive recreation and open space resource
47	for residents of King County for nearly fifty years, and
48	WHEREAS, the loss of open space in this area would have impacts on the North
49	Lake-Hylebos watershed and the habitat it provides, and
50	WHEREAS, use of conservation future tax levy funds for purchase of property
51	rights in the North Lake-Hylebos watershed and surrounding areas for wildlife habitat,
52	urban passive-use natural area or open space system addition meets the criteria in K.C.C.
53	26.12.025 for project selection, and
54	WHEREAS, the Juanita and Inglewood-Finn Hill neighborhoods and their
55	surroundings in and near the city of Kirkland include a number of parks and open space
56	areas, including Saint Edward State Park, Big Finn Hill Park, O.O. Denny Park, Juanita
57	Woodlands Park, Juanita Beach Park and Juanita Heights Park, that would benefit from
58	additional trails and open space connections to provide habitat corridors as well as
59	pedestrian and bicycling connectivity between parks and neighborhoods; and
60	WHEREAS, the addition of trails and open space connections in this area would
61	provide for the preservation of tree canopy and indigenous vegetation in urban areas, as
62	well as the establishment of natural greenways through developed areas that will support
63	local wildlife migration and open space linkages, and

64	WHEREAS, the loss of open space in this area would limit connectivity between
65	a network of state, county and local parks and open spaces and affect local vegetation and
66	wildlife, and
67	WHEREAS, use of conservation future tax levy funds for purchase of property
68	rights for trails and open space connections in the Juanita and Inglewood-Finn Hill
69	neighborhoods and surrounding areas for wildlife habitat or open space system addition
70	meets the criteria in K.C.C. 26.12.025 for project selection, and
71	WHEREAS, the Woodinville Wine Country and its surroundings in and near the
72	Sammamish River valley include regional trails and multi-use corridors, including the
73	Sammamish River Trail and the Eastside Rail Corridor, protected farmland and open
74	space areas that would benefit from additional trails and open space connections to
75	provide habitat corridors as well as pedestrian and bicycling connectivity between parks,
76	trails and community destinations; and
77	WHEREAS, the addition of trails and open space connections in this area would
78	provide for the preservation of farmland and green spaces, as well as the protection of
79	natural wildlife corridors between existing open spaces and the Sammamish river, and
80	WHEREAS, the loss of open space in this area would limit connectivity between
81	a network of regional trails, protected farmland, riparian corridors and open spaces and
82	affect local vegetation and wildlife, and
83	WHEREAS, use of conservation future tax levy funds for purchase of property
84	rights for trails and open space connections in the Woodinville Wine Country area for
85	wildlife habitat or open space system addition meets the criteria in K.C.C. 26.12.025 for
86	project selection;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The council establishes as a priority for the conservation futures citizen oversight committee's consideration during the annual project selection and funding recommendation process, one or more projects that includes the purchase of property rights for the purpose of wildlife habitat, urban passive-use natural area or open space system addition in or near the North Lake-Hylebos watershed, to preserve the existing open space and stands of trees.

B. The council establishes as a priority for the conservation futures citizen
oversight committee's consideration during the annual project selection and funding
recommendation process, one or more projects that includes the purchase of property
rights for the purpose of trail or open space connections, wildlife habitat or open space
system addition in or near the Juanita and Inglewood-Finn Hill neighborhoods, to provide
connectivity between the network of state, county and local parks and open spaces.

100 C. The council establishes as a priority for the conservation futures citizen 101 oversight committee's consideration during the annual project selection and funding 102 recommendation process, one or more projects that includes the purchase of property 103 rights for the purpose of trail or open space connections, wildlife habitat or open space 104 system addition in or near the Woodinville Wine Country area, to provide connectivity 105 between the Sammamish river, existing regional trails and multiuse corridors, open 106 spaces and neighborhood destinations.

D. The department of natural resources and parks, water and land resources division, is requested to work with landowners and jurisdictions in which properties reflecting these priorities are located, in submitting project proposals that meet this

priority, as part of the 2017 conservation futures tax levy funds selection process

111 provided for in K.C.C. 26.12.010.
